December, 1938." Just think! If they had accepted my poem a month earlier the magazine might still be running today! Or is that stretching things a bit? One thing I never do is stretch things. Well ... maybe the readers' minds ... just a little.

Even the poem "Lilacs" has a story. I was very moved a piece of music called 'Lilacs'', written by the late Sergei Rachmaninoff, certainly one of the world's greatest pianists and composers. He was then living on West End Avenue in New York, in a huge apartment. I decided to send him a copy. It was an artistic and personal thing and I didn't care if it was published or

Rachmaninoff liked the poem so well that he wrote me a nice letter and sent his autographed picture. Of course I framed the picture and hung it above the piano. Years later when he died I

was greatly saddened, for here was a man who appreciated lilacs, little lavender poems written by a greater hand than ours...

American Cancer Society Research Grants In Texas

Scientists at North Texas State University will take a second look at a rejected Chinese anti-cancer compound in their search for chemicals with greater cancer-killing potency and less harmful side effects.

Dr. Robert E. Lyle, Prof. and Chairman of the Chemistry Department at NTSU. said new studies will be

made to produce a compound similar to Camptothecin, a chemical agent made from the bark of trees grown in mainland China and used there, experimentally, to treat cancer.

Dr. Lyle and his colleagues are seeking ways to overcome the poisonous side effects of powerful chemicals such as the antibiotic, adria-

mycin, commonly used to treat cancer in this country. His researce is supported by an American Cancer Society

His research team is now remodeling adriamycin, substituting a chemical bond of nitrogen rather than oxygen to hold the molecule together. It is thought that the bad side effects of adriamycin are due to "fragments" of the substance which break off during the antibiotic's passage into the cancer cell.

A less toxic analog of the Chinese compound, Camptothecin, will also be sought, using experiments made four years ago by Dr. Lyle and other scientists at the University of New Hampshire and Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York. These tests were suspended in the United States after it appeared that the compound, although extremely active against the cancer cell, was too toxic for human consumption. However, reports indicate that tests in China continued.

Chemists at North Texas State, also exploring chemicals that cause cancer have found clues to why some known carcinogens found in food, do NOT always cause cancer. Their studies have shown that nitrosamines can be so chemically bonded in the digestive tract that their cancer-causing ability is "shackled." Ordinarily nitrosamines, which can be formed from nitrites used to preserve food and amides produced by the digestive tract, are among the most potent carcinogens. Now it appears the body may disarm







Extension Highlights

Fertilizing pastures this spring offers many benefits to Texas forage producers. says Dr. Neal Pratt, forage specialist for the Texas A&M Extension Service.

"One of the most attractive advantages of a sound fertilization program is to improve the quality of pasture this spring and summer." notes Pratt. 'While fertilizer helps produce more forage. it can greatly improve quality through the growing sea-

With last year's drought fresh in mind, forage producers should fertilize pastures for insurance against dry weather. With uncertain rainfall later this summer. fertilization would be desir-

able Producers can use fertilizer to replenish hay supplies by harvesting excess pasture growth during spring and early summer. Hay supplies last year were severely limited, so farmers and ranchers should plan toward rebuilding hay supplies.

Producers may wish to fertilize a pasture as a basis for rebuilding forage supplies and beef cow numbers. since increased forage is needed before expanding herd numbers.

To benefit from pasture fertilization, additional high quality forage should be


