The purpose of the trip, January 6-14, was to assist Bo and Jeanne
Bartley at El Rancho de Los Ninos, a children's ranch and orphanage near Flores in Northern Guatamala.
Bo had come through Bovina on
December 19 in December 19 in an International Scout donated by a church in Las
Cruces, New Mexico, and picked up clothing and school supplies collected by the Bovina folks. He had then shipped the Scout and its bulging contents on down to Miami, Florida and had arrived back in Guatamala himself a few days before we arrived.
Our group left Lubbock early Saturday morning, January 6 and
flew via Dallas and Houston to flew via Dallas and Houston Guala City, arriving about p.m. (Guatamala is in the same time zone as Texas.)
Bo and Jeanne met us at the airport and we rode through Guatamala City's hectic traffic to Saturday night with the Bartleys and their adopted daughter, Jennifer (age nine), and a couple named Santiago and Blanca and their girls.
Santiago and Blanca are dorm parents at El Rancho, but were in Guatamala City to take care of the
house there, while Bo and Jeanne were in the U.S. during December We also met Christopher, a plump who is in the process of being adopted by a family in Illinois. On Sunday morning, January 7 , we flew a two-prop Aviateca

will also be discussed. Training will also be offered in caring for burns, poisong, emergency child birth

Much of this is still jungle, but is slowly being developed into orchards, garden El Rancho has no electricity except a generator that runs at certain hours of the day; no telephone, and a well which can be
pumped only about 15 minutes at pumped only about 15 minutes at a
time before it goes dry. After about an hour water again seeps into the hole. Bo is hoping to soon develop another water source from a pond about a quarter of a mile
down the way from the main buildings.
The most important part of El Rancho, of course, is the "ninos"--the children. Presently Bo and Jeanne care for about 44 38 boys) ranging in age from 18 months to teenagers.
