Although the 1989 Income Tax forms 1040, 1040A and 1040EZ closely resemble those which taxpayers used last year, there are a number of notable changes, that include: Social Security numbers are now required for dependents age two or older; taxpayers who claim the child and dependent care credit or who receive excludable benefits from an employer-provided dependent care assistance program must report the taxpayer identification number, name and address of the care provider; and exemption amounts have been increased to \$2,000 each.

If you need a Social Security number for one of your dependents, you should contact the Social Security Administration for Form SS-5.

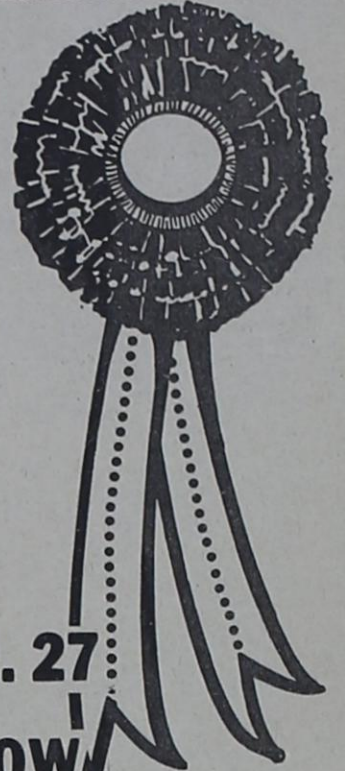

In games last Tuesday Kress scored a pair of wins, a pressure-packed 61-58 win over the Fillies, and a 78-60 win over the Mustangs.

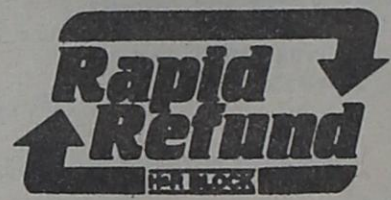
Cindy Quintana scored 24 points and Miss Griggs 14 to pace Bovina. Juan Reyna came up with a 26-point effort for the Mustangs.

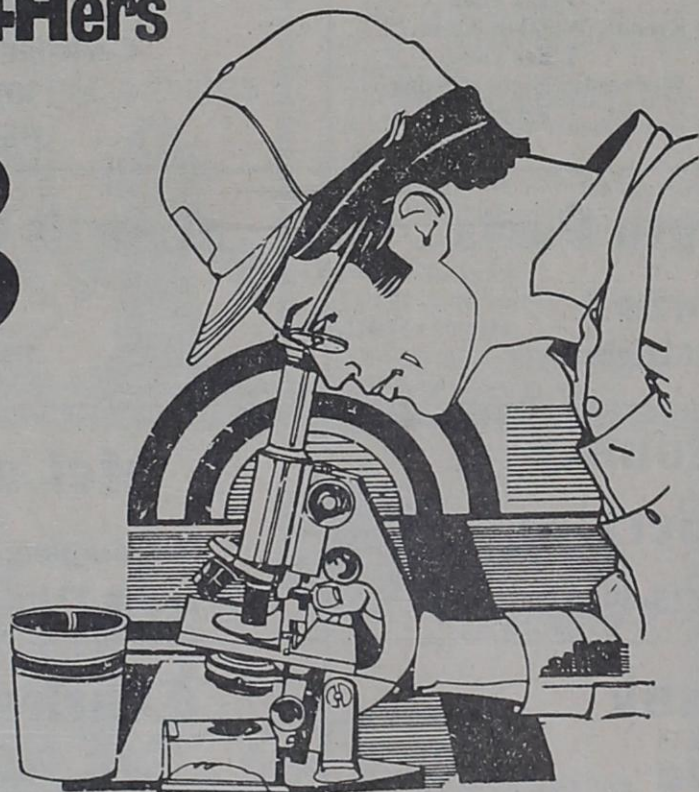

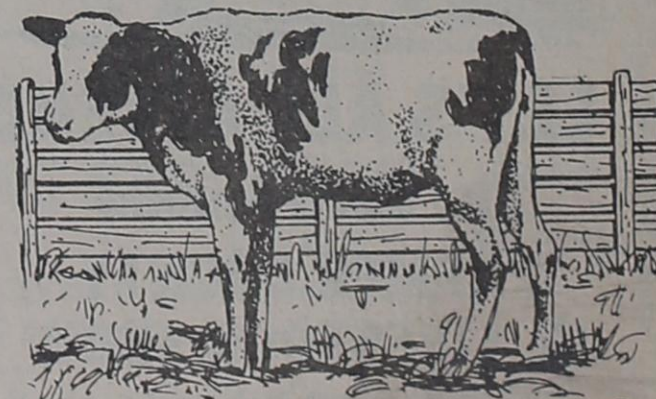
