**Walter Bob Duncan** Finds Name To Be 'A Nightmare'

What's In A Name?

"What's in a name?". Shakespeare once wrote. "That which we call a rose by any other name would smell as sweet." True. But for Walter Bob Duncan there were times when any other name would have been a blessing. You may think there's nothing unusual about the name Walter Bob. You would be right if Walter Bob had been born a boy.

"It's been a real nightmare," the petite 78-year-old lady said in recalling the experiences she has had with her name. "There were many times I had to go back and sign my name two or three times before they would accept the signature as mine.

Walter's father died before she was born. His name was Walter Scott Robinson.

'My mother was young and I was to be her only child. She wanted to name me after my father," Walter explained.

Mrs. Duncan grew up in Mills County, Texas, and at the age of 20 she married Carl Duncan. The couple moved to Arizona four years later. They had two boys and a girl and never left Arizona. Duncan died six years ago, after 51 years of marriage.

'He was a wonderful man," Mrs. Duncan said of her husband. "Generous to a fault. I remember one time when we were ranching on the Sandy...he invited the governor of Arizona and two college professors to dinner. It wasn't until two o'clock that afternoon that he told me they were coming.'

Mrs. Duncan feels the Lord intervened in her behalf that day. The rain fell hard. GHS Class Of '44 Burro Creek rose fast and the guests were unable to the dinner.

While Walter often wished for a feminine name, her husband liked her unusual name. He always told me I should be glad I wasn't just like everybody else, she said.





Badly stained tile especially in showers resents a cleaning problem. Often, there's a rough, white build-up on them, a brownish soil along the grout lines and a dark, varnish-like stain in the center of the

Avoid using abrasive cleansers - they harm the cermaic glaze. Just follow these three treatments:

shower base.

Rough, White Build-Up . These are hard water salts left when water evaporates.

The same thing happens in a tea kettle. Use a commercial tile cleaner weekly to dissolve the scale, and then

Brownish Soll on Grout Lines - This is mildew. Scouring and scrubbing will work, but the mildew will grow back. Spray an ordinary household spray disinfectant on the dry tile, and let it stand overnight. In the morning, sponge the mildew off. It should not return if this treatment is repeated
