A Public Health Clinic for immunization against polio, measles, mumps, rubella. diphtheria, pertussis and tetanus will be held in Goldthwaite on Wednesday. May 23rd at the Senior 10:30 a.m. and 12 noon.

At present, children enterimmunized against polio. diphtheria, tetanus, measles, pertussis and rubella. In September of 1979, mumps will be required for all children through age seven.

As of September 1, 1978, all children between the ages of 18 months and 12 years.. were required to be immu-

nized against measles. After this year, the maximum age of the child requiring immunization will be raised. Parental histories of measles will be acceptable until September 1, 1979, and after Citizens Center between that must be verified by physician's statement.

Parents concerned about immunization records need to keep a few things in mind. You need to have an up-to-date immunization record when your child enters school. It should be validated by a licensed physician or public health clinic.







