Goldthwaite Sales Tax Nets Slight Increase

State Comptroller Bob Bullock Thursday said the local option one-percent sales tax provided more than \$467 million in revenue to Texas cities in 1979.

Goldthwaite received \$5,706.42 for month of December, bringing the total to date to \$39,005.48. compared to \$38,726.84 for same period in 1978.

Bullock also announced the December city sales tax allocation to more than 900 Texas cities totaling \$76.6 million, boosting tax payments for this year \$42.2 million more than 1978.

"From that standpoint, there was reasonable, but not recession-proof growth in city sales tax rebates." Bullock said.







DPS Director Wilson E. Speir estimated that 67 persons would be killed during the Christmas holiday weekend and another 56 persons would be killed during the New Year holiday weekend. Both counts are 102 hours long.

He added that the Christmas count starts at 6 p.m. Dec. 21 and continues until midnight Dec. 25, while the New Year count starts at 6 p.m. Dec. 28 continuing until midnight January 1.

Sheep and Goat Raisers Weekly Report

It looks like most Texas sheepmen and bobcat trappers are out of the woods for this season. A lawsuit that threatened to shut down bobcat pelt exports and, as a result bobcat trapping, has been settled in a reasonably fair way.

Cat pelts may now be exported from all but 28 Texas counties. The restricted area lies mainly in the Panhandle where neither bobcats nor sheep are found in any abundance. New Mexico sheepmen and trappers didn't fair nearly as well; the Washington judge's ruling prohibits export of cat pelts from any part of that state. Other no-export states are North Dakota, Florida, Wisconsin and Massachesetts. Oregon has a split status similar to

The lawsuit was filed by the notorious Defenders of Wildlife, which claimed that state-by-state export standards drawn up by the federal Endangered Species Scientific Authority failed to guarantee protection of bobcats, as required by international treaty. Ironically, Defenders was instrumental in tangling the U.S. up in that treaty and can thus be considered something of a godfather to ESSA. The lawsuit is an indication that ESSA was not radical enough to please its mentor.

State game managers have felt just the opposite about ESSA since its creation, but found themselves forced to give at least moral support to the federals in fighting the Defenders suit.

Texas Parks & Wildlife spokesman, Bill Brownlee, says the 28 Texas counties from which bobcat pelt exports have been banned make up part of the range of a limited-number bobcat sub-species. Defenders and its sympathizers have claimed that this subspecies is either threatened or endangered. This, in addition to the fact that only about 270 cat pelts were tagged from that area, is supposedly the reason for the export restriction; the low take is assumed to mean that the sub-species cat is indeed in short

supply. Brownlee points out, however, that there are only 271 licensed trappers in the entire Panhandle. Licensing is not required for cats, but the licensed-trapper figure is a good indication that trapper density is very low in that area and offers a good explanation for the scant cat take in the restricted counties.

Unfortunately, he adds. the only way TP&W can determine whether or not the sub-species needs protecting (and thus the only hope for getting the ban lifted) is from information gathered when pelts are tagged. If inablility to sell pelts for export results in fewer pelts being taken, the natural consequence will be less information to go on.

The current lawsuit, how-

ever, applies only to this season's harvest, and unless Defenders files another suit next year, the restrictions could amount to only a short-term hardship for Panhandle trappers.

This may be a biggy, and at the very least should prove extremely interesting. On Jan. 15 the Texas Department of Agriculture will sponsor a "predator control summit meeting" in Austin. U.S. Interior Secretary Cecil Andrus is to be the keynote speaker, and the meeting is expected to include panel discussions with representatives from both the livestock industry and environmentalist

Texas agriculture commissioner Reagan Brown is

credited with organizing the affair. The exact location is not yet confirmed, nor is an expected appearance by U.S. Rep. Kika de la Garza. If the South Texas congressman is able to make it sparks should fly -- hope fully those sparks will kindle fires in the right places.
