IF LOCAL residents need something to get their "dander up," then the new rate proposal being sought by General Telephone Company (GTESW) should do the trick.

According to information delivered to us, the company proposes a considerable rate increase in order to make up for revenue deficiencies it has experienced since 1983.

If approved, GTE's rates for a business telephone will go up locally from \$22.15 per month to \$33.65. This is an increase of \$11.50 per month, or 51.9 per cent.

For residences, the basic charge will increase from \$8.55 for a one-party per month to \$14.45 per month, a jump of 69 per cent.

The company blames the downturn in the Texas economy as the main culprit in their rate request.

"We have known with increased expenses and capital investments that eventually we would have to ask for increased revenues. But with the downturn in the economy, we wanted to delay this as long as possible," said E.L. "Buddy" Langley, GTE Southwest president.

However, the rate request will be opposed by the various city councils with whom GTESW deals with.

Our city manager says, "The cities' stance, dating back to their 1984 request, was that they (GTE) could not show that they were due a rate increase. In fact, the independent study showed that the (telephone) rates should actually be decreased."

The cities involved have a steering committee which works in the legal realms of the proposal, and they will take up this latest request.

The city officials say that the 'phone company proposal will turn into a long, drawn-out fight between GTE and the cities it serves.

"The bottom line won't be determined for awhile," said one city spokesman.

Imaging Center Is Repaired

The Mobile Breast Imaging Center which travels to Parmer County Community Hospital will not be making its usual rounds from May 27-June 13.

The center is at the factory in Fairfield, Ohio for revisions due to a weight distribution problem.

"The hospital regrets any inconvenience this may cause some of you. If you are scheduled in this two week time period, I will be contacting you by phone, if I haven't already, to reschedule your appointment," says Elda Hart, hospital administrator.

The Mobile Breast Imaging Center will be made more efficient and attractive. It will be revised from a diagnostic coach to a screening coach and will have a new floor plan and a new color scheme.

The Labsonic Ultrasound will be removed from the unit. The unit was not being utilized to its potential and the space could be used more effectively.

The center will have the newest state of the art mammographic processor, cassettes and screens to have the highest quality films.

The next appointments for Friona will be June 15, so the local hospital will be the first or second to use the new unit.

"We are excited about the improvements and hope you will feel free to visit us when we are in your community," said Sharon Hagans, R.T. and MBIC Unit Manager.

In 1922, Frank and Bertha Ayres moved to Bovina with their family. They found one other family who were members of the Church of Christ. The Frank Ayres and sister, Sam Martin families began meeting on Sundays in the old Bovina School house. For four years, the Ayres and Martin families encouraged others and the church began to grow.

Without a full-time preacher, the small group depended on part-time preachers like Ebb Randal,

He spent eleven days in the Methodist Hospital in Lubbock where he had therapy for the burns and skin graft surgery for the burn on his arm. The skin graft took one hundred percent and Bryan is enjoying being in his own home again even though he is restricted as far as being outside too much or going anywhere due to the new skin and the possibility of infection.

Bryan is the grandson of Herbert and Cecelia Schueler of the Rhea community.

A "Love Fund" has been set up at Friona State Bank for Bryan.

In 1926, the first church building was constructed and was used until 1946. The preaching duties were shared by Brothers Chapin and S.C. Wall from 1929 to 1939.

Charles Goodnight moved from the Lubbock area and became Bovina's first full-time preacher serving from 1939 to 1940. Brother Frank Ayres built the first parsonage, a two-room house that sat where the church's sign is now located in front of the building.

In 1956, the congregation chose and ordained their first elders and deacons. The first elders were Levi Johnson, who served until his death in 1975, Buck Ellison and B.L. Marshall who both still serve as elders. The first deacons to serve were Tom Rhodes, Sr. and Lloyd Killough.

The congregation has had the distinction of having a father and son serve as full-time ministers at Bovina. Brother R.A. Hartsell preached at Bovina in the early 1950's and his son, James Hartsell, served as minister in the late 1950's.

In 1961, while Alfred White served as minister, the present parsonage was constructed. Billy Mayfield and Lee Capps were ordained as deacons.

Don Stone served as minister from 1961-1966. Don designed and supervised the construction of the church building now being used. Construction was completed in 1962. He also constructed the sign in front of the building and painted the signs on the highways coming into Bovina.

In 1962, E.O. Johnson was ordained an elder. Marlin Ferguson, Joe Pinner, Rex Bearden, James Boardman and Howard Ellison were ordained as deacons for the congregation. Howard Ellison, son of Buck Ellison, graduated from the Sunset School of Preaching in 1967, and now serves the Church of Christ at Logan, New Mexico as the preacher and an elder.

In 1967, Albert Rushing was ordained an elder, with Thomas Rhodes, Jr. and Aldred Mills as deacons.

In 1970, Richard Roberts and Dale Cox were installed as deacons.

From 1970-1978, Cecil Bunch served as minister. During this time, Thomas Rhodes was ordained an elder and William Gromowsky, Jon Lin Riddle, Kenneth Whitecotton, Dennis Johnson, Billy Lynn Marshall, Wayne McClaran and Kent

McClaran were installed as deacons.

During the 1970's, the Bovina congregation supported the Christian Children's Home in Portales with over \$15,000.00 in cash donations plus a gift of 16,000 pounds of grain. Many other gifts and donations were made to the Portales Children's Home. The Portales Children's administrators officially named Cottage Three as the "Bovina Cottage." Today, the group still sponsors the "Bovina Cottage" and provides them with gifts and clothing at Christmas time.

In 1981, Kenneth Gauntt was ordained a deacon and in 1983 he was ordained as an elder.

In 1983, Billy Lynn Marshall and John Lin Riddle were ordained elders. Marks Lanham, Cris Wylie and Lowell Primrose were ordained as deacons.

The present elders are Buck Ellison, Kenneth Gauntt, B.L. Marshall, Billy Lynn Marshall, Thomas Rhodes and Jon Lin Riddle. Deacons are William Gromowsky, Marks Lanham, Kent McClaran, Wayne McClaran, Lowell Primrose and Cris Wylie. Bob Martin is the current minister. Mission works supported by the church are Jim Taylor in Poncha Springs, Colorado and Tex Williams, director of World Bible School.

"The church owes a debt of gratitude to the Frank Ayres and Sam Martin families, who began the church in Bovina, and especially owe a special prayer of thanks to God for Brother Frank Ayres who, for years, labored tirelessly, to keep the work of the Lord alive in Bovina, Texas. Most of all, we thank God for the priceless gift of His Son Jesus Christ and His finished work on Calvary that made it all possible," a spokesman for the church concluded.

The elderly and handicapped will be served first, beginning at 8 a.m. that morning, says Pearl Cervantez.

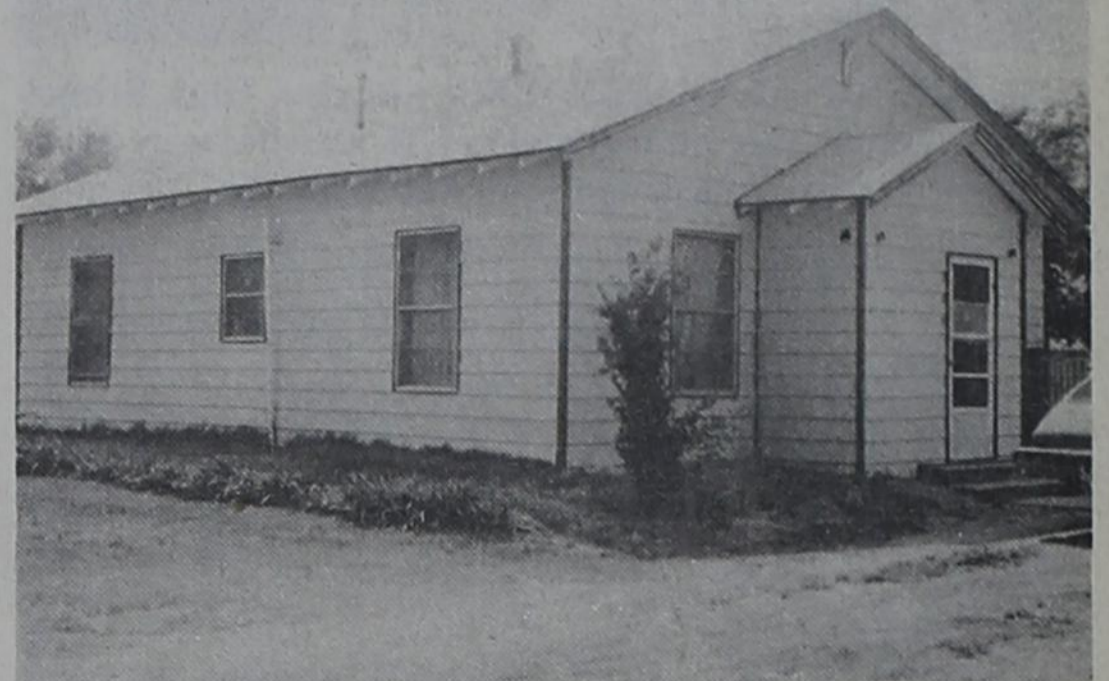
Those receiving the commodities are asked to bring their own sacks.

The commodity program is administered through the county commissioner's court.

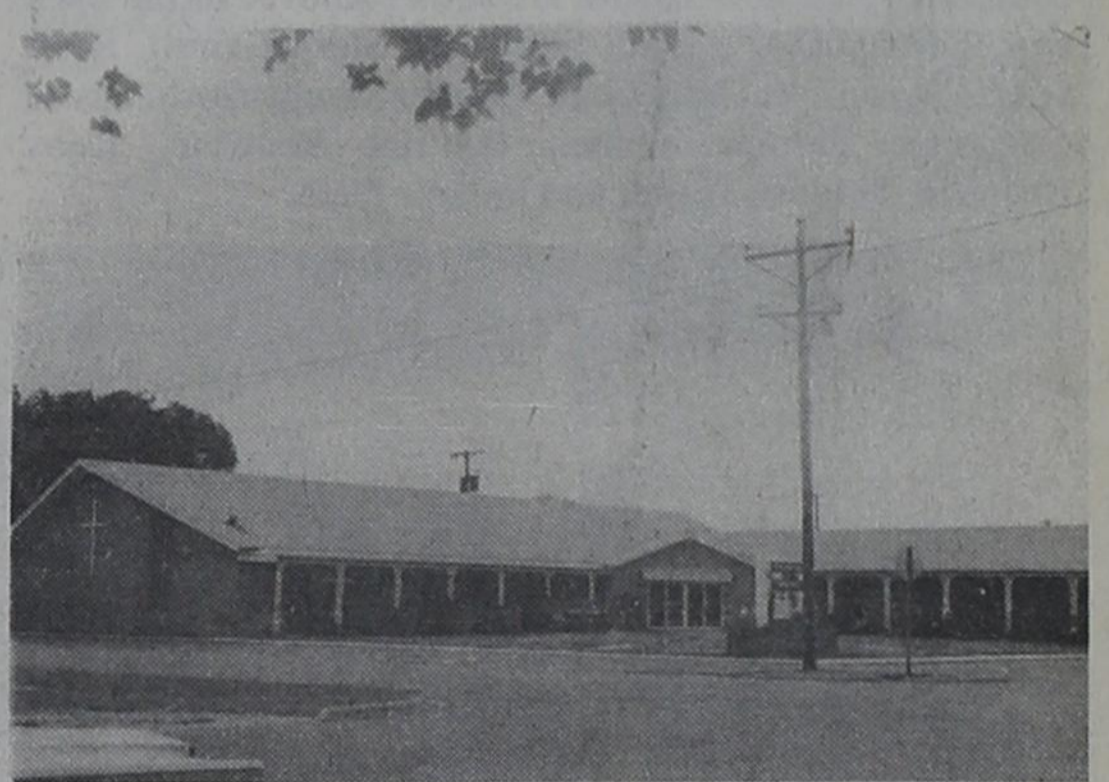
Swimming Lessons Are Scheduled

New FmHA Rules Should Aid Farmers

Proposed rules, which could assist hundreds of farmers who are behind on their Farmers Home Administration loans, were issued today, according to FmHA Texas State Director J. Lynn Futch.

The new regulations will carry out portions of the Agricultural Credit Act passed by Congress last December. "There will be a 30 day comment period and additional time for any appropriate changes before the regulations become effective," Futch said.

One of the changes would allow FmHA to reduce the delinquent debt of certain borrowers to help them stay in business. There are approximately 5,000 delinquent borrowers in Texas, many of whom should be assisted with this program once implemented.

In related actions, the agency also issued proposed regulations to:

*Make it easier for farmers or their families to lease or buy back homesteads that have been lost through foreclosure or conveyance;

*Set up a program to help members of minority and socially disadvantaged groups to purchase farmland and develop an outreach program to carry it out;

*Establish a new administrative appeals unit distinct from the rest of the agency to handle borrower grievances;

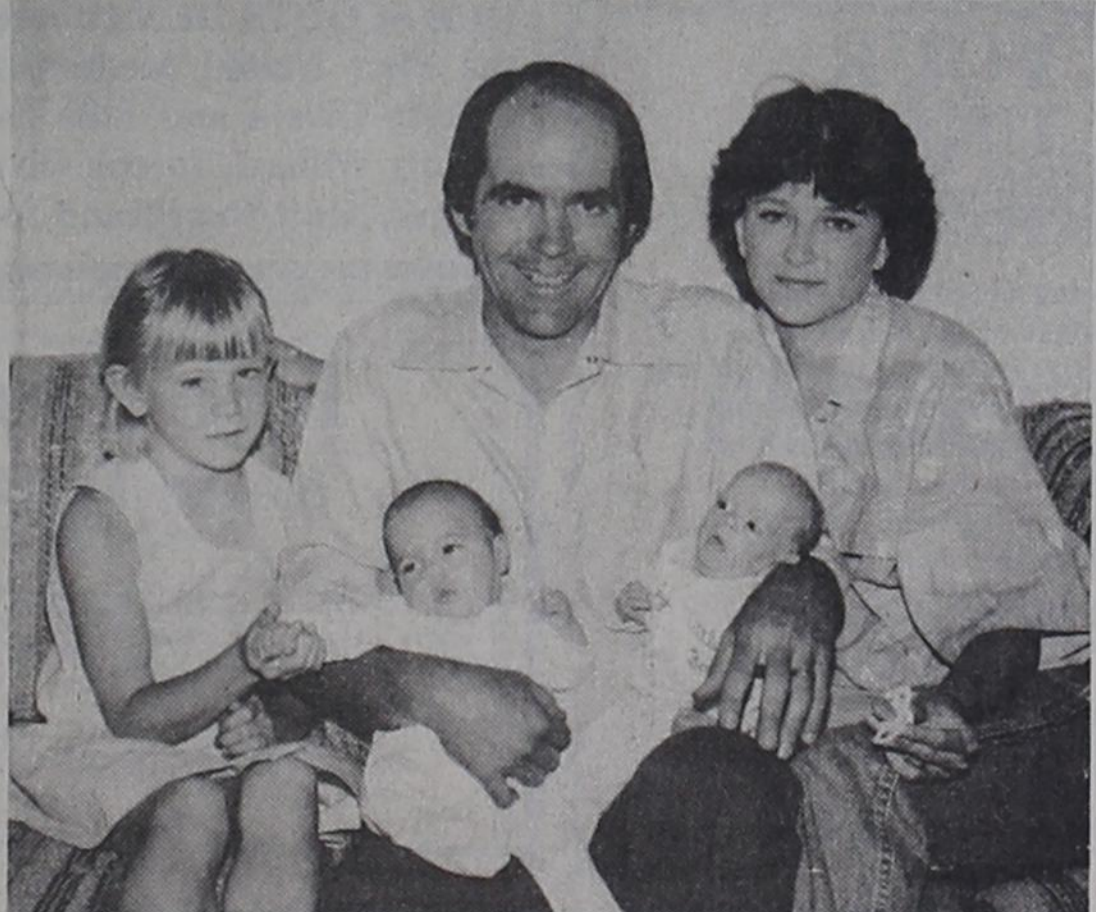
*Certify and participate in state mediation programs.

Immunization Clinics Set Schedules

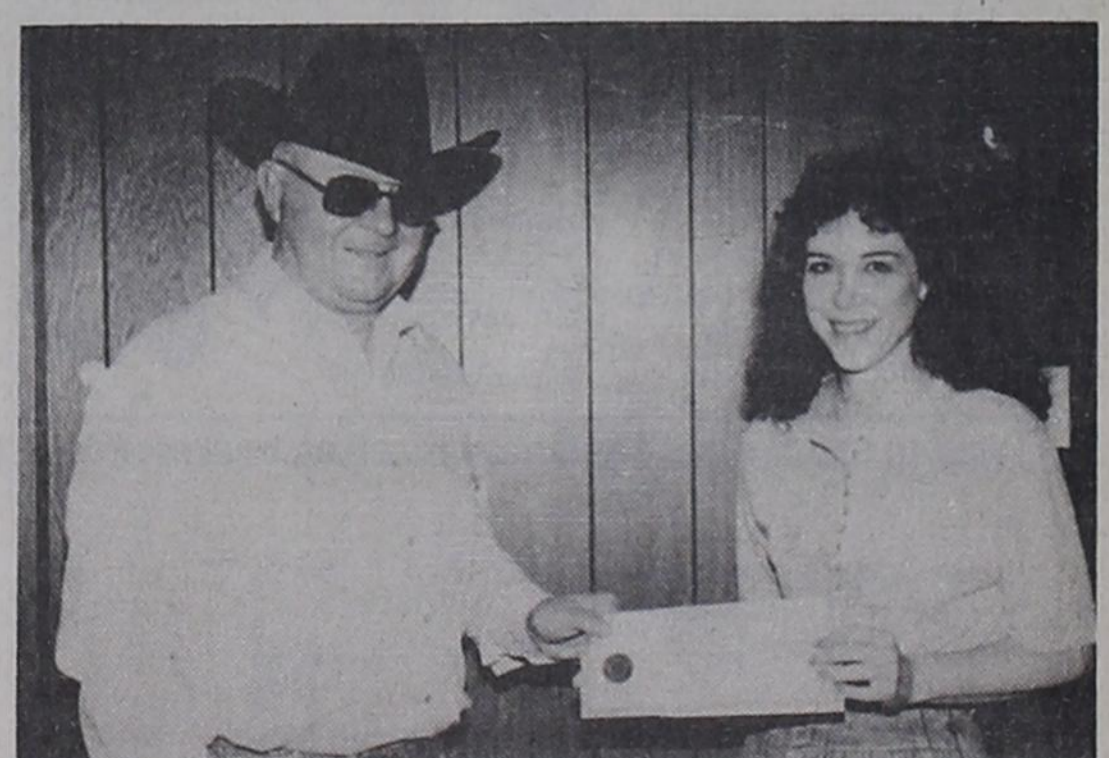

The Texas Department of Health is charging money to help with the cost of keeping the clinic open. The amount of money charged will be based on family income and size, and the ability to pay.

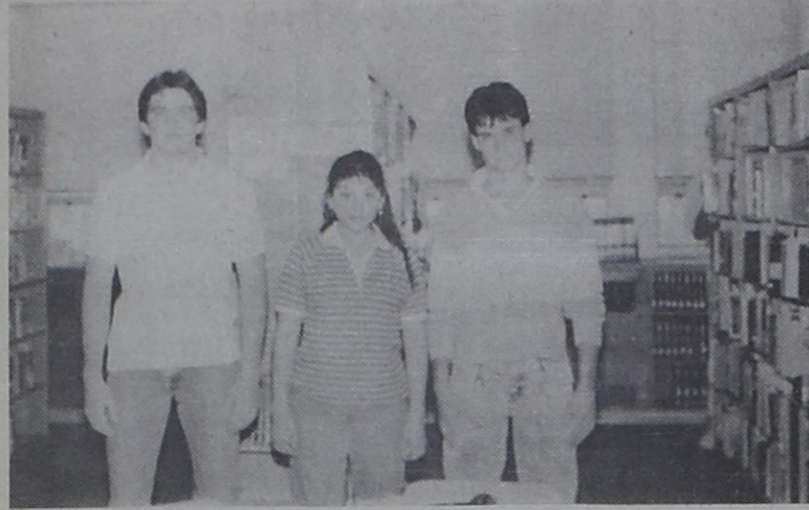

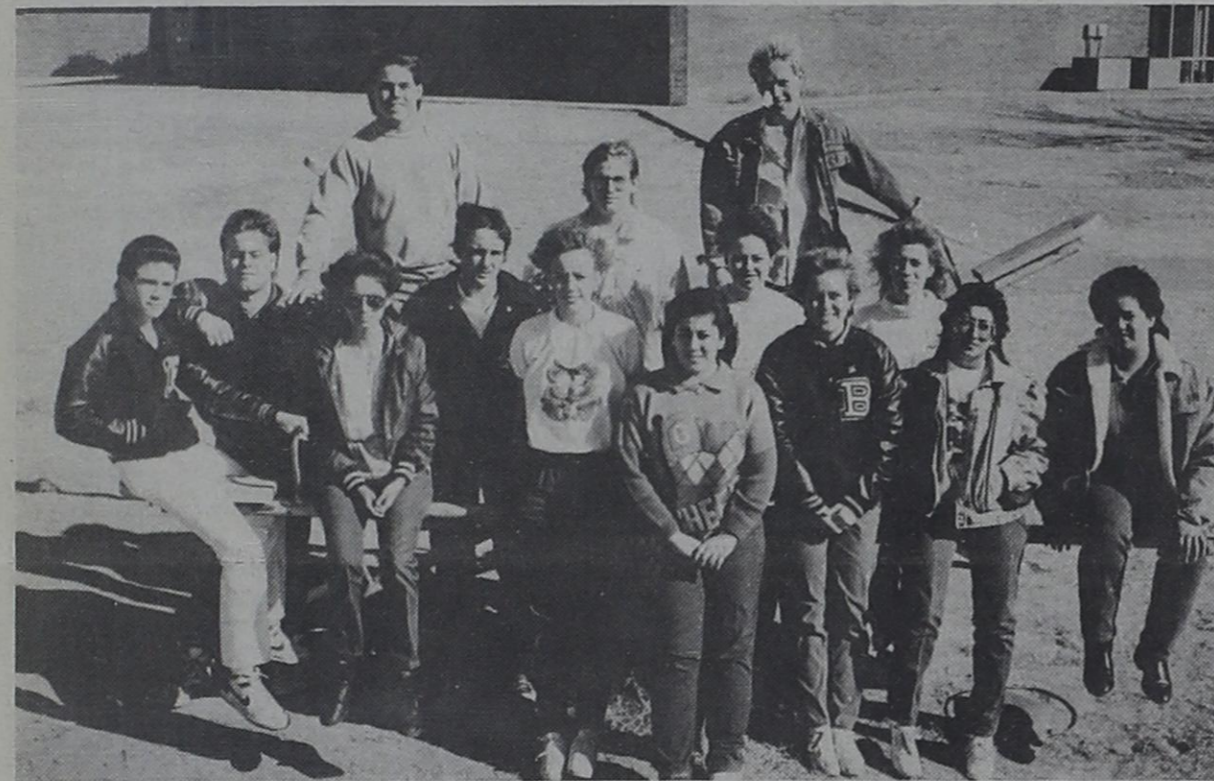
