Davis said a U.S. Governmen Accounting Office report has defined biotech as "any technique that uses living organisms to make or modify products, to improve microorganisms for specific uses.' "This could help to provide for mankind's most basic needs ranging from food supplies to care," ${ }^{2}$ Davis said.

"Biotech advances will enable cattiemen to tailor a product more increase productivity er desires, increase productivity, and lower production costs." He said this
increased productivity means more beef production per cow. This ultimately may mean fewer, mor technology intensive cattiemen.
Davis said that highe costs of such competing meats as poultry and pork will force cattlemen to $m$
biotechnology.
