Montgomery, Ala., Oct. 28 .- At to day's session of the inter-denominational association of the colored school league in session here, Pres den W. H. V. Mixon of Selma, Ala. in his annual address urged the suppression of crime among the black race as the cure for lynching. Rev Mixon said in part:

"The evil allurments, confusion and untimely death will continue in the land as long as idlers remain.

"We can never save our boys and our girls until the legislature and congress destroy the pistols and guns, distilleries and liquors.

"Boys and men who carry deadly weapons carry with them sorrow and death. They have prearranged murder or expect to be murdered.

"Bad literature, bad company and bad heart will bring any man, woman or child to disgrace, and often to death without even a premonition of that fact. Lynchin, flaying and the burning human being will be removed from the globe when the causes are removed.'

French Minister Arranged North Sea Incident Hearing.

REPUBLIC'S PEACE AT STAKE.

The great gravity of the situation. especially in Great Britain, where the inflamed state of public opinion might at any moment driven the government to extreme measures, and the danger involved in delay were keenly appreciated in the French capital. 

STOPPED CRUELTY OF INDIAN. Incident of the Ranching Days of the


President. Prof. Brander Matthews tells his English literature class the following ncident of President Roosevelt's career as ranchman which was told to him by the president himself:




