> Keith's arm was mangled and all the skin and muscle tissue were torn from the arm. The boy was in the machine two hours before they were able to free him. He was then taken by helicopter to St. Mary's Hospital in Lubbock. Dr. McClanahan came from Muleshoe and also paramedics from the area.

Wayne Smith, manager of the gin, who is also Keith's father, said the boy is still in the intensive care unit at St. Mary's Hospital in Lubbock, but that he does not have feeling in his thumb and two fingers. One artery was not damaged and is supplying blood to the hand. He was in surgery for eleven hours following the accident.

Mr. Smith said he talked with the boy's mother Monday morning in Lubbock and he was going to be put on a liquid diet, so his condition is definitely improving.


