County commissioner Ernest Anthony of Friona said highlights of the conference were federal redistricting requirements for counties in 1990, sanitary landfills and solid waste management and 9-1-1 rural addressing.

Yoakum County Judge Jim Barron of Plains, the association president, opened the meeting.

John Gilmartin, county officials program specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, said county judges and commissioners who took part in all general sessions earned 8.0 continuing education units from

Temporary Jobs Are Available

The U.S. Census Bureau has issued a call for Parmer County residents to apply for temporary jobs.

Census work will last between two and eight weeks for most workers. They will receive \$5.00 an hour plus mileage for any official use of a private vehicle.

Applicants for the temporary positions must be 18 years old or over, a U.S. citizen, have a valid driver's license, a Social Security card and take a written test.

The work consists of driving or walking in designated areas of the county to follow up on addresses that do not respond to the census questionnaire. Office jobs that will be filled are those of data transcriber and clerks.

The census benefits all Americans. Reapportionment of the U.S. House of Representatives and redrawing of legislative district boundaries are based on census figures, while census numbers are used to distribute federal, state and local government funds to provide assistance to communities for housing, health and human services programs.

If you are a low-income worker who maintains a household for yourself and a dependent child for all of 1989, you may be eligible for an earned income credit. Because the credit is intended to offset the impact of social security taxes, you may receive a refund based upon this credit, even though you have not paid any federal income tax.

The credit is 14 percent of earned income of up to \$6,500--so, the maximum credit is \$910. Earned income includes wages, salaries, tips or other compensation, and earnings from self-employment. The maximum credit applies from \$6,500 to \$10,240 of earned income and decreases to zero when income reaches \$19,340.

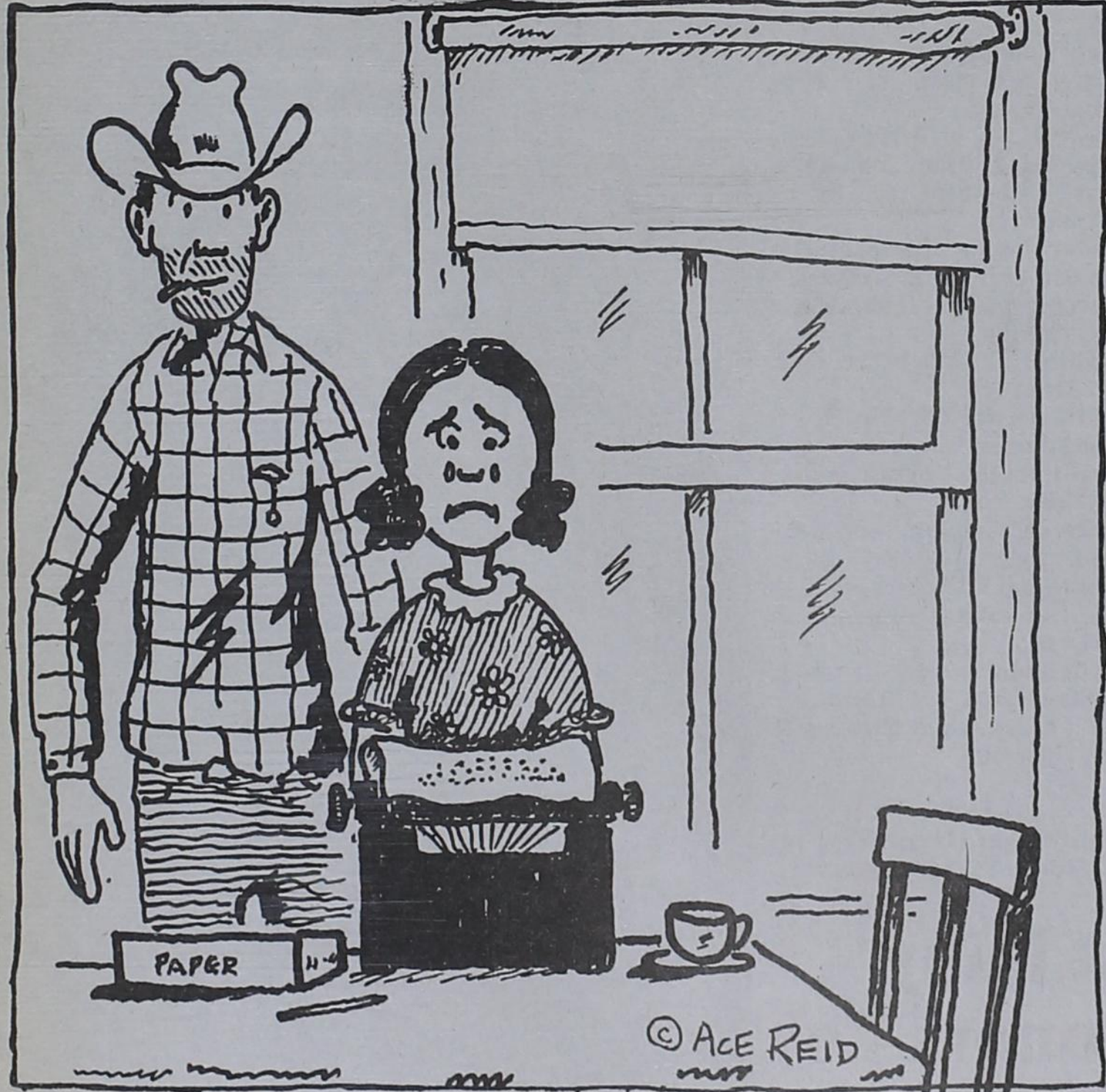

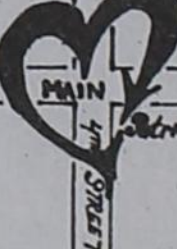

Youngsters At Houston

Ten FFA members from Bovina will be joining 4-H and other FFA members from throughout the state for showing competition at the upcoming Houston Livestock Show February 17-March 4 in the Astrohall.

These FFA and 4-H exhibitors compete in one of two divisions of the Houston Livestock Show--the junior show division. The other division, the open show, attracts its exhibitors from the world's agricultural industry, primarily professional breeders and ranchers.

Entries in both the open and junior shows combine with horse show entries to make the Houston Livestock Show the world's largest.

Youngsters from Bovina FFA attending the Houston Show will be Shane Branson, Ryan Dyer, Tobyn Dyer, Jimmy Gilbreath, Penny Johnson, Angel Porras, Ralph Serna, Leah Steelman, Andy Stormes and Wayne Stormes.

Representing 841 Texas 4-H Clubs and FFA chapters, the junior show is expected to exceed 12,000 entries this year. A variety of animals are shown in the junior show division: market steers, market swine, market sheep, market poultry, beef and dairy heifers, breeding sheep, goats, commercial steers and breeding rabbits.

The four market animal categories represent animals raised by the exhibitor as food sources. Top animals in each of these categories are eligible for their individual market auctions. Total money paid in 1989 at the four junior show auctions exceeded \$4.5 million.

"Our show, the world's largest livestock show, attracts some of the finest breeders and ranchers from throughout the world. Yet during the second week of livestock show competition, the young 4-H and FFA exhibitors take over the Astrohall. We feel these outstanding youngsters exemplify the purpose behind our event--to benefit youth and support education," said Steve Woodley, Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo assistant manager.

In addition to the upcoming livestock show competition, a series of lectures, seminars and live animal demonstrations again will be on the calendar for the month of February--the International Stockmen's School. Held February 14-17, at the Marriott Hotel Astrodome and at the Astrohall complex, this school focuses on lectures and seminars delivered by agricultural experts from throughout the world.

New shows scheduled for the open show division of the 1990 Houston Livestock Show are the Bradford Open Cattle Show and the Romagnola Open Cattle Show.

Horse show activities officially kick off the upcoming Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo beginning February 15 with cutting horse competition. The National Cutting Horse Association World's Championship Finals is scheduled for Thursday-Sunday, February 15-18. Also, a celebrity cutting horse contest featuring nationally known figures and local celebrities will be held on two of those days, Thursday and Friday, February 15-16. The 1990 Horse Show also will feature competition from six different breeds.

S-E held leads of 15-2, 31-12 and 44-21 in the Tuesday game.

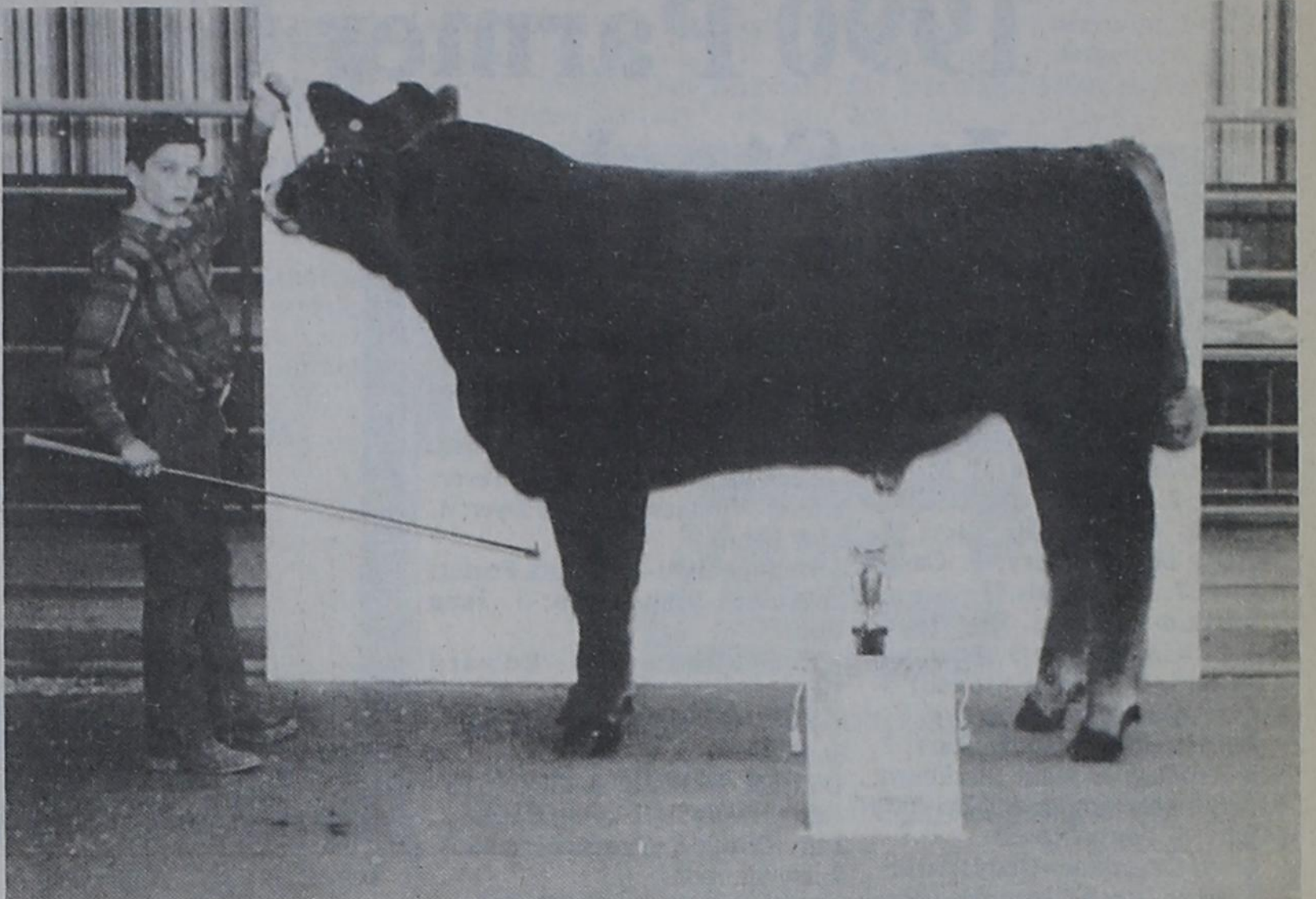

Kress led the Fillies, 24-8, 41-19 and 50-31 at the quarter marks.

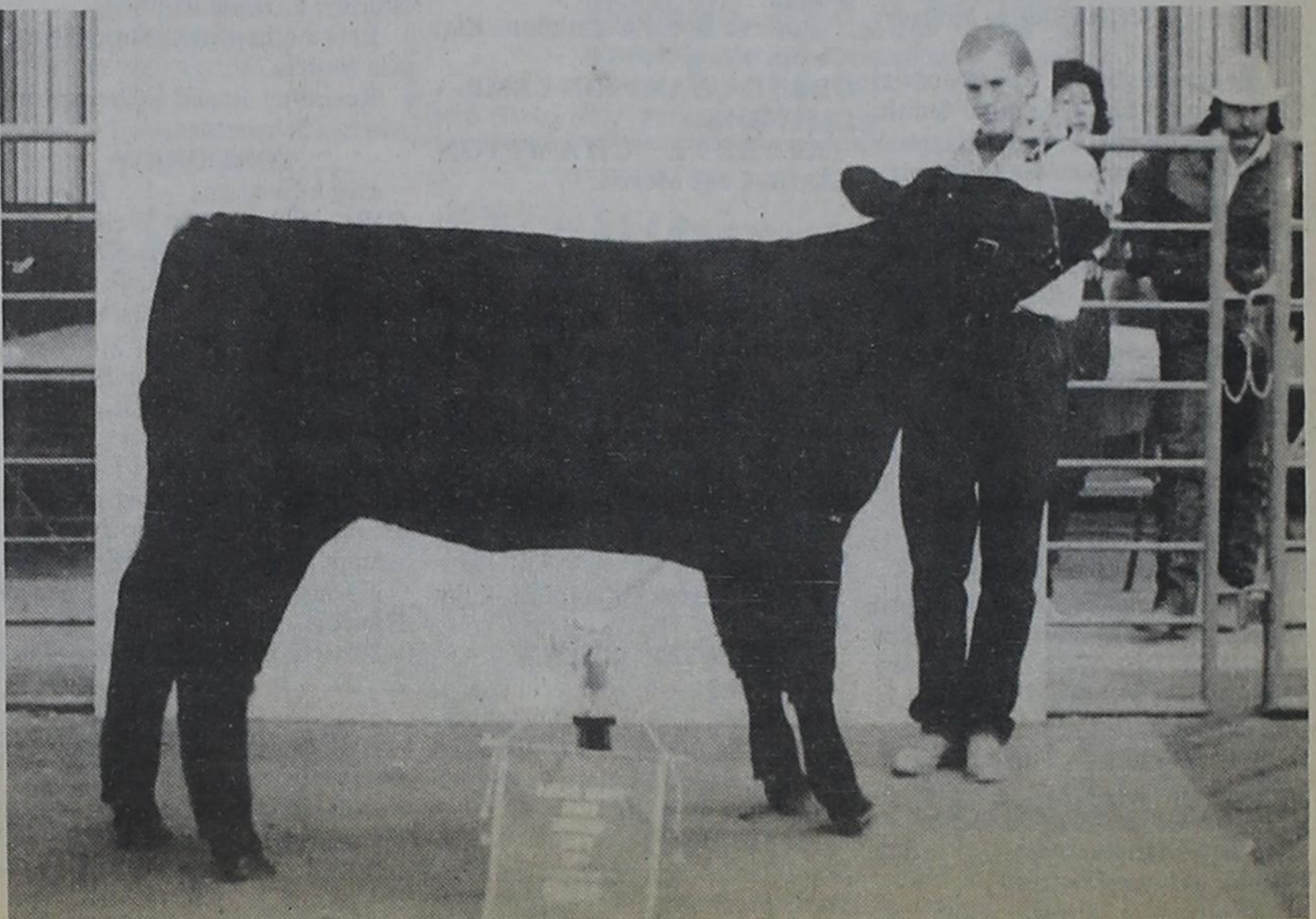

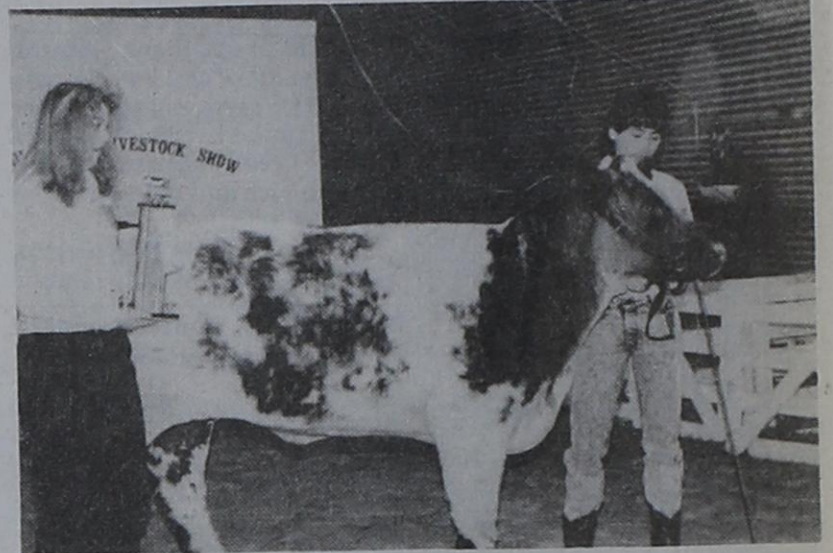
