FORTY-SEVEN KILLED.

Iwo Trains Met on Bultimore and and Wreck Caught Fire

Chicago, Ill. - More than one half the passengers on an immigrant train on the Baltimore & Ohio road were killed or injured in a collision Monday between the passenger train and a freight near Woodville. Ind.

One hundred and sixty-five passengers were on the train, and of these 47 were either killed outright or were burned to death in the fire which broke out in the wreckage immediately after the collision. The names of all of the dead will probably never be known, as 45 of the bodies were consumed in the flames or were so badly burned that identification is impossible.

Thirty-eight people were injured and several of these will die. Eighty others escaped unhart, but lost nearly all their baggage and clothing.




