

PRUSSIAN MINE DISASTER.

An Explosion of Fire Damp Occurs While 600 Miners Are At Work 2,300 Feet Underground.

Saarbruck, Rhenish Prussia. -A fire damp explosion occurred Monday morning in the Reden coal mine at St. Johann-on-Saar, opposite Saarbruck and caused the loss of from 150 to 200 lives. The mine is owned

by the Prussian government. Up to 6 o'clock Monday evening 7 bodies had been brought out, and 5 corpses were known to be underground Only 50 men have been brought out and of these the doctors say at least 35 will die, as they are frightfully in jured through having been hurled against the walls of the galleries by the force of the explosion.

Aften all the rescuers had reached daylight, according to one version, a second terrific detonation was heard under ground. But according to another report many of the rescuers were still below when the second explosion occurred, and it is estimated that the casualty list from two explosions reaches a total of 300 men.

OUR TRADE WITH CUBA.

Exports Were \$2,000,000 Greater and Imports \$10,000,000 Less in 1906 Than in 1905.

Washington, - Never before in the history of United States commerce with Cuba was the export trade of this country to that island so great as during the past calendar year. American importations from that republic are considerably below that for the preceding year, according to state ment issued by the bureau of statistics of the department of commerce and labor Sunday. The total exports from this country to Cuba were valued at \$46,491,944, which is more than \$2,000,000 over the exportations for 1905
