Spur Ranch Sold

New York. Feb. 20.-The Swenons, New York bankers and owners of the famous S. M. S. ranch at Stamford, Texas, have purchased for cash some h If million acres of fertile cotton an I grain lands in Dickens tounty, together with about 40,000 head of well bred cattle, all known familiarly as the "Spur" properties, but formerly owned by the Espuela Land and Cattle Company, London, England.

Diversified test crops have been from \$40 to \$100 per acre. grown on the Spur tract, most of which is smooth farming land of remarkable fertility. The Santa Fe Railway has right of way through the tract and is building into this property. Other railway lines are prospecting.

The policy of the Swensons will be to disperse the cattle as rapidly as possible without sacrifice and open the land to farmers, operating through their headquarters in Stamford. The deal is said to involve several million dollars, all cash, and is the largest ranch and cattle deal or recent years, certainly the largest cash deal of that kind ever made.

Congo Reform

Prospects are encouraging for a reform of the outrageous abuses in the dministration of affairs in the Congo independent State. The natives in that vast equatorial region have been reated with an incredible inhumanity. They have been forced to labor for he companies that deal in rubber; cannibals have been employed as guards over the rubber gatherers; litthe children have been bound out to labor for long terms of years; the administration of justice has been so and that the name of the place where the chief courts sit is regarded as a word of ill omen. Men, women and children have been mutilated and beaten and otherwise maltreated. The Congo Independent State is controlled at present by the king of the Belgians. In 1889 the king made a will bequeathing to Belgium his rights in the country and in 1890 Belgium made an agreement by which it secured power to annex the territory after ten years. Reform, explains Youth's Companion, is likely to come through the assumption by the Belgian parliament of its powers under this agreement. The chamber of representatives voted last month to annex the territory, and the senate may have approved the plan before this paper is in the hands of its readers. When this is done, irresponsible peronal government will cease. The king, who has been an autocrat in the Congo, will have no more power there than he has in Belgium. UNDER RESTRICTIONS JAPAN. ESE CHILDREN ADMITTED

## ALL JAP LABORERS ARE BARRED

States and Japan-All Parties Are Said to Be Satisfied - Board of Education Will Control.

Washington, Feb. 19, - Japanese children are to be admitted to the white schools of San Francisco under certain restrictions; skilled and Japan are barred from the main land of the United States and American laborers, skilled and unskilled, are to be excluded from Japan. This is the basts of the agreement between President Roosevelt, Secretary Root, Mayor Schmitz and the San Francisco school board as an adjustment of the anti-Japanese agitation which brought about the segregation of Japanese children the San Francisco schools.

agreement means that the schools of San Francisco will be conducted in the same manner as they before the board of education adopted the resolution last October providing for the segregation of Japanese except that the adult Japanese who are in primary grades must continue to attend the oriental schools and that Japanese children under sixteen will be admitted to classes of white children of their own ages. While the resolution of school board, as amended, reads: "Children of alien birth" it is freely admitted by Mayor Schmitz and his associates that the resolution will apply only to the Japanese children and that the change in the wording was to make it plain to the Tokio government that no discrimination was intended against Japan-

Assistant District Attorney Willlams of San Francisco, who is actng as legal adviser to Mayor Schmitz and the board of education since negotiations have been pending, said tonight:

Meaning Between the Lines. "To understand the exact meaning of the statement given out by Mayor Schmitz tonight it will be necessary to read between the lines. The only concession we have made is to admit Japanese children to the white schools, while in return the adminstration has brought about the exclusion of Japanese laborers from this country. "This is only a temporary agree-President Roosevelt has given us direct and positive assurances that he will at once begin negotiations with Japan for the purpose of bringing about a new treaty that will exclude Japanese laborers skilled and unskilled, from continental





The principal address was by Dr. A. W. Halsey, home department of the board of foreign missions, on "Foreign Missions, a Great World Force. Dr. Halsey expressed his opinion

on the Japanese immigration question. He quoted a statement to the effect that the Hearst papers are advocating the equality of all men This he declared was untrue. He denounced the work of these papers and of the mayor of San Francisco and striving to shut out the immigration of the Japanese, declaring that discrimination against men because of their color is discriminaton against the very constitution of the United States."

Afterwards, referring to the christianizing of China, he spoke of a certain native and his work and

"Think of excluding such men from America and allowing the mayor of San Francisco to remain." His remarks were greeted with

The following resolution, introduced by Rev. G. W. Comer, of Osceola, Neb., were adopted without reference to committee by a large majority, although a negative vote was heard:

Forty-three bodies were removed and more than sixty miners are still in the compartment where the explosion occurred. Whether they are dead or not is not known. Many of the men who were killed were Japanese.

EARLY NORTHWEST VOYAGES.

Account of the Arctic Tripe That Have Been Made.

Beginning with the American dis-covertes of John Cabot in 1497, the search for the northwest passage was for many years the object of rival expeditions from Denmark, England, France and Portugal, says A. W. Greely, in the Century. It was Frobisher, however, who in 1576-78 first gave a distinct national character to the quest. John Davis of Davis' strait, followed in three voyages, 1585-88, and then, in 1612, came the illustrious and hapless Henry Hudson, whose motto was that explorers should "achieve what they had undertaken or else give reasons wherefore it will not be.

The search for the Atlantic side closed for two centuries with the voyage of a great seaman, William Baffin, who, in a tiny boat of 55 tons, with a miserable equipment, but an undaunted heart, attained, in 1616, the highest north in the western hemisphere, 77 degrees 45 minutes N., and discovered three radiating sounds, Jones, Smith and Lancaster, the last being the eastern entrance to the longsought passage.


