By carefully looking over the
wheat field at maturing time, beads way be found which have been entirely destroyed. The wheat ker-
nels have become nothing more nels have become nothing more
than a black mass of spores. When than a black mass of spores. When
the crop is threshed, many of these ae crop is thresined, many of thes
pores cling to the grain and are arriel back to the wheat field seeding time. Soon after the when sernel gervinates, the smut spores also germinates. The germinated
spore or fungus develops a thread like structure which enters the wheat plant. This does not appear To damage the wheat plant very mueh duriag its growing period but it is there, ready for work, as soon as the wheat heads appear.

following year. The stinking smu is the kind most commonly found
ing year. The stinking smu destroys the kernels only, while it destroys the kernels only, while
