Prominent Socialist Editor Ends Life.

Girard, Kan., Nov. 11.—J. A. Wayland, founder and owner of the Appeal to Reason, a Socialist weekly newspaper published here, shot and killed himself when in his home last night.

Between the leaves of a book lying on the bed the following note was found:

"The struggle under the competitive system is not worth the effort; let it pass."

Friends of Mr. Wayland attribute his act to despondency over the death of his wife, who was killed in an auto accident a year ago.

Mr. Wayland was to have appeared today in the federal court at Fort Scott, Kan., to answer to a charge preferred by the government against the several editors and owners of the Appeal to Reason, of circulating through the mails defamatory matter concerning an official of the federal prison at Leavenworth.

"Although I alone am responsible for what appears in the columns of the paper, Mr. Wayland of late had seemed much disturbed over the pending case," said Fred Warren, managing editor of the Appeal to Reason, today.

Mr. Wayland was 58 years old. He had founded his paper here fifteen years ago. Previously he had edited papers in Harrisonville, Mo., Pueblo, Colo., and Greenburg, Ind., and had founded a Socialist colony at Ruskin, Tenn.

Comments On The Election.

The following comments on the election were clipped from Sundays Dallas News, and we think they will be of interest to our readers.

Daily Tribune (Los Angeles): The Tribune makes the prediction that four years hence the Democratic party, united in this campaign by the prospect of victory and the power of patronage, will find itself rent in twain. Progressive Democrats will not be satisfied by the Wilson policies. The country will be divided into two great National parties—the Progressive and the reactionary. The Republican party will disappear as a factor in the life of the Nation. Its conservative members who supported Wilson in this election will remain in the Democratic party. Progressive Democrats, dissatisfied with Wilson's administration, will align themselves with the Progressive party. We shall see a new alignment of the political forces of the Nation and then have a fair test of the comparative strength of the Progressives and the reactionaries.

New York Times: The Democrats will be in power. Evidently they will be in complete possession of the power of the executive and the legislative branches, for it is probable that the Senate will be theirs. The party will devote itself to works of progress, but of sane and healthy progress. It will not destroy. For one thing, it will neither wreck nor maim any of our institutions. That danger has been escaped. It will revise the tariff, but it will so disprove those amusing Republican predictions of ruin and panic that their very authors will smile at the memory of them. Honest business will have all freedom, equal opportunity, every lawful right and privilege. Mr. Wilson has said that dishonest business will go to jail. We think he means it. That is not a program at which the righteous need stand in fear.

Sneed Released on Bond

Fort Worth, Texas, Nov. 10.—Unless there is an unexpected change of the present program the second trial of J. B. Sneed for the killing of A. G. Boyce, Sr., in this city Jan. 13, 1912, will begin in the Seventeenth District Court tomorrow. All arrangements for the trial have been completed. A special venire of 300 has been summoned, the attorneys have had numerous conferences and witnesses and relatives of the parties are arriving or have arrived.

County Attorney John Baskin said late today that the State was ready and that the trial would proceed. W. B. Scott, attorney for defendant, stated this evening that the defense was ready and that there would be no motion for continuance unless it was found after the roll of witnesses had been called that some important ones were absent or could not be had in time to testify. If the trial begins in all probability it will last two or three weeks, its duration depending in a large measure on the time consumed in procuring a jury.

Attorneys for the prosecution are County Attorney John Baskin, W. A. Hanger, D. W. Odell, William Hendricks and Jordan Cummings. Attorneys for defense are McLean, Scott, McLean & Bradley, and Cone Johnson.

J. B. Sneed, the defendant, was released on bond of \$20,000 as fixed by the higher court, at noon today, and immediately repaired to the Seibold Hotel, where rooms had been engaged for him. Cone Johnson, one of his counsel, is stopping at the same place. The release of the prisoner was made when Sheriff Rea received a telegram from the Sheriff at Vernon stating that the bond had been signed there. The bond is for the appearance of the defendant at Vernon to stand trial for the killing of Al Boyce at Amarillo Sept. 14, 1912.

Oct. 24. Greeks take the city of Servia. Loss, Greeks 1,000, Turks 3,000.

Oct. 28. Servians capture Uskup. Loss, Servians 1,500, Turks 3,200.

Nov. 1. Greeks sink Turkish cruiser. Loss, Turks 260.

Nov. 8. Fall of Saloniki. Greek loss 2,500, Turks 4,000.

Nov. 11. Fighting about Tehalaja forts. Loss, Bulgarians 8,000, Turks 20,000.

THE ANNUAL EXPENSE OF MAINTAINING MUD HOLES EQUAL TO ENTIRE COST OF STATE CAPITOL.
