# Windbreak Planning Important

Trees can provide a lot of protection for those gusting winter winds, and the time to. plan windbreaks is at hand. However, actual planting time won't be until late winter or

early spring.

"A windbreak planting can provide a comfort and protection zone," points out Dr. Michael Walterscheidt, forestry specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System. University System. "Wind-breaks also can be planted for livestock protection, wildlife habitats, Christmas tree production, fruit and nut production, and aesthetics."

will provide full protection from wind to a distance of 10 times the height of the tallest trees and provide some protection out to 20 times the height of the tallest trees.

Density of windbreaks is also important, says Walterscheidt. A moderately dense windbreak acts as a filter and allows for less turbulence on the inside of the windbreak. Not only do windbreaks affect wind velocity, but they can reduce mid-day summer temperatures up to 5 degrees out to 20 times the height of the windbreak.

To begin preparations for a windbreak, mow or plow the site in early fall to help reduce weed competition, suggests the specialist. If there is a chance of erosion, sow a cover crop during the winter, leaving a 2-foot-wide strip for the tree planting. Plow and disk the site again two to three weeks before planting. It is important to conserve soil moisture so seedlings will get off to a good start.

"When planning the wind-

and hardwood rows should be 20 feet from the conifers.

Trees for windbreak plantings are available from the Texas Forest Service. Landowners in the northwestern half of Texas should obtain trees from the Lubbock nursery; landowners from the southeastern part of Texas should order trees from the Alto nursery. Trees from the Alto nursery will be available

for planting in late December while Lubbock nursery trees will be available in March.

Walterscheidt adds that using a drip irrigation system will increase tree survival and growth. More information on planning and planting windbreaks is available from county offices of the Extension Service or the Soil Conservation Service,

## Finding ripe watermelons more science than art

(EDINBURG)--There is nothing worse on a hot summer afternoon than slicing into a good-looking watermelon only to find out that it isn't even close to being

So how do you find one that's ripe and ready to eat? According to Jim Hartz of the Texas A&M Extension Service in Edinburg, there is a way to tell the ripe ones from the green ones right off.

"Inspect the ground spot where the watermelon has been touching the ground," Hartz says. "If the ground spot is white, then the melon is not ripe.

"But, if it has turned to an ivory-cream color, then you're looking at a melon that's pretty close to ripe," he

Where does this leave the age-old tried-n-true method of "thumping" watermelons to discover if they are ripe?

Hartz says if you've been thumping watermelons a long time, it'll help, but if you haven't, thumping wouldn't do much good.

"It's fine if you've thumped 7,000 or so watermelons in your time, but for someone

who hash't grown up around it, there's no way that's going

to tell you anything." Another sure-fire way to find a ripe watermelon is to stop in at a farmer's market or at a roadside stand, since most of the crop is in by now. If anyone knows a ripe melon, it's the person who brought it in from the field.







QUESTION: Is Kaposi's sarcoma

an old or new form of cancer?

ANSWERline: Much remains to be learned about this baffling, often fatal disease. It was first observed among male patients in Europe in 1872, then in several areas of Africa, but rarely in other parts of the world. Unprecedented outbreaks among homosexual men brought Kaposi's sarcoma dramatically to public attention in the United States in 1981 and 1982. It has since been found in immigrants from Haiti, hemophiliacs, and recipients of kidney transplants whose immune systems have been intentionaly suppressed to prevent rejection of the transplants. Kaposi's sarcoma is no longer considered unique to homosexuals, as it was first thought to be. Dark blue or purple-brown nodules or plaques frequently appear on pa-

QUESTION: Will the widespread dumping of toxic chemicals and the use of pesticides in homes and elsewhere lead to a general increase in the risk of cancer for everyone?

ANSWERline: Most reports of such contamination deal with the potential danger of cancer. So far there has been very little confirmed evidence of increased cancer risk. However, prudent public policy certainly calls for a clean environment to eliminate or minimize any

such risk.

QUESTION: If you smoke cigarettes but don't inhale, is there any danger?

ANSWERline: Wherever smoke touches living tissue, it does harm. All smokers have an increased risk of lip, mouth and tongue cancer - no matter what they smoke. And all smokers, even those who don't inhale, including pipe and cigar smokers, have some increased risk of lung

QUESTION: Is Hodgkin's disease

cancer.

a form of leukemia? ANSWERline: No, the diseases are two different forms of cancer, but both involve the spread of abnormal white blood cells into the circulatory system. Hodgkin's disease affects the body's lymphatic system, the network which transports infection-fighting white blood cells through a fluid called lymph. As the disease spreads, abnormal white blood cells multiply and crowd out normal ones, leaving patients susceptible to a number of infections. Leukemia is a cancer of blood-forming tissues, mainly bone marrow, lymph nodes, and spleen. There are several types of leukemia, depending on the type of white cells involved

and their rate of growth.

The most common first sign of Hodgkin's disease is a swollen lymph gland, usually in the neck, which lasts for three weeks or longer. Other symptoms include persistent fatigue, weight loss, fever, night sweats, nausea and vomiting. Any symptom should be checked by a physician.

QUESTION: Is cancer in children rare?

ANSWERline: Yes, only about 6,000 new cases of childhood cancer are reported yearly. However, cancer is the chief cause of death by disease in children between 3 and 14. Cancers in children tend to develop more quickly than adult cancers because body tissues are growing rapidly and the cancer grows right along with them. Leukemia accounts for almost half of all cancers in children. Cancers of the bone, kidneys, brain and nervous system are also common.


