After holding public hearings in Amarillo last Monday, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department met in special session on Wednesday, December 5.

Because of the decline in pheasant population this fall, the wildlife officials decreased the daily bag limit for pheasant cocks.

Under the emergency regulation, the limit will be two pheasant cocks per day, with four in possession. This has been decreased from the three daily bag limit and six in possession immediately prior to the opening of the season on yesterday, Saturday, December 8.

Hundreds of hunters flocked into the area starting on Friday, and fields teemed with pheasant hunters on Saturday morning, the beginning of a pheasant season that will conclude on December 20.

### Blood Drive

### Breaks Record Set At Snyder

Muleshoe area residents really 'turned out' Wednesday, as they donated 214 pints of blood to the United Blood Services of Lubbock, in what UBS said was the second largest, one day, blood drive ever conducted by them.

The local blood drive was surpassed only by a blood drive conducted some time ago at Snyder.

Conducted at the First United Methodist Church fellowship hall, people patiently waited in line to donate blood to help someone down the road.

All people involved with the blood drive expressed their appreciation for the fantastic donations, which had a goal of 200 pints, and to everyone for their patience and waiting to give the lifesaving fluid, which may help save the life of someone desperately needing the transfusion.

Each donor received a M\*A\*S\*H t-shirt for their donation.



**SHOPLIFTING PREVENTION WEEK IN MULESHOE**--Muleshoe Mayor Charles Bratcher seated, signed a proclamation Thursday morning designating the week of December 9-15 as Shoplifting Prevention Week in Muleshoe. Several seminars and educational sessions were scheduled to help merchants and business people 'spot' shoplifters with the stores as busy as they are in this holiday season.

Shoplifting is one of the major problems for businesses, especially at Christmas season, when shoppers jam the stores while shopping for those special people at Christmastime.

Because of the problem, the Muleshoe High School Chapter of DECA (Distributive Education Clubs of America) and Muleshoe Mayor Charles Bratcher have declared December 8-15, Shoplifting Prevention Week in Muleshoe.

DECA students, as future retail business managers/owners, and as present employees on retailing, said they would like to emphasize the awareness of the problem, particularly during this Christmas season.

During public programs, conducted during this week, DECA and the Muleshoe City Police Department, will be stressing

the penalties involved for shoplifting, as well as the great losses to businesses--which consumers pay for through higher prices.

"More money is lost in retailing through shoplifting than in armed robberies," warned a DECA spokesperson. "The figures nationally are staggering and the public must be made aware of the cost to each of us for the dishonesty of a few."

Some of the activities being conducted this week will be presentations from City Police Sgt. Wayne Holmes who will be speaking to high school vocational co-op students from the retailer's point of view, what to watch for in the store, and other shoplifting safety tips.

Grade school and junior high presentations stressing the cost and risk involved to the ship-lifter and employee responsibilities as honest citizens reporting suspicious situations, will be presented.

*Both will be conducted in the city council meeting room at the Muleshoe City Hall, with one session at 10 a.m., and the second at two p.m.*

*Sgt. Holmes, along with the Muleshoe Chamber of Commerce and Agriculture, urge all businesses to be represented at least one of the seminars.*

A shoplifting survey has been completed by high school and junior high students. Retailers will be asked to complete a similar survey during this week. Business people are being encouraged to display anti-shoplifting slogans.

## Red Cross Seeking Funding

With the onset of winter and the use of home heaters, the American Red Cross faces its most costly type of disaster in

Bailey County, the single family fire, says Carl Hill, of the Lubbock County Chapter of the American Red Cross.

In the case of such fires, it is the responsibility of the Red Cross to provide cash vouchers for food, clothing and a new residence, he reminded.

Hill said sometimes this aid extends to providing funeral expenses, as with the Cervantez family, victims of a tragic mobile home fire in Muleshoe last spring. Such assistance

generally costs the Red Cross hundreds of dollars, obligations which are met by Bailey County contributions to the American Red Cross.

Besides aiding disaster victims, Bailey County contributions are used to support Red Cross service to military families. Military services include helping servicemen get emergency leave and providing financial assistance to service personnel and their families.

Hill added that because of the tremendous cost of such programs in Bailey County, the Red Cross is urgently seeking the financial support of Bailey County residents. This support is provided by membership in the Red Cross.

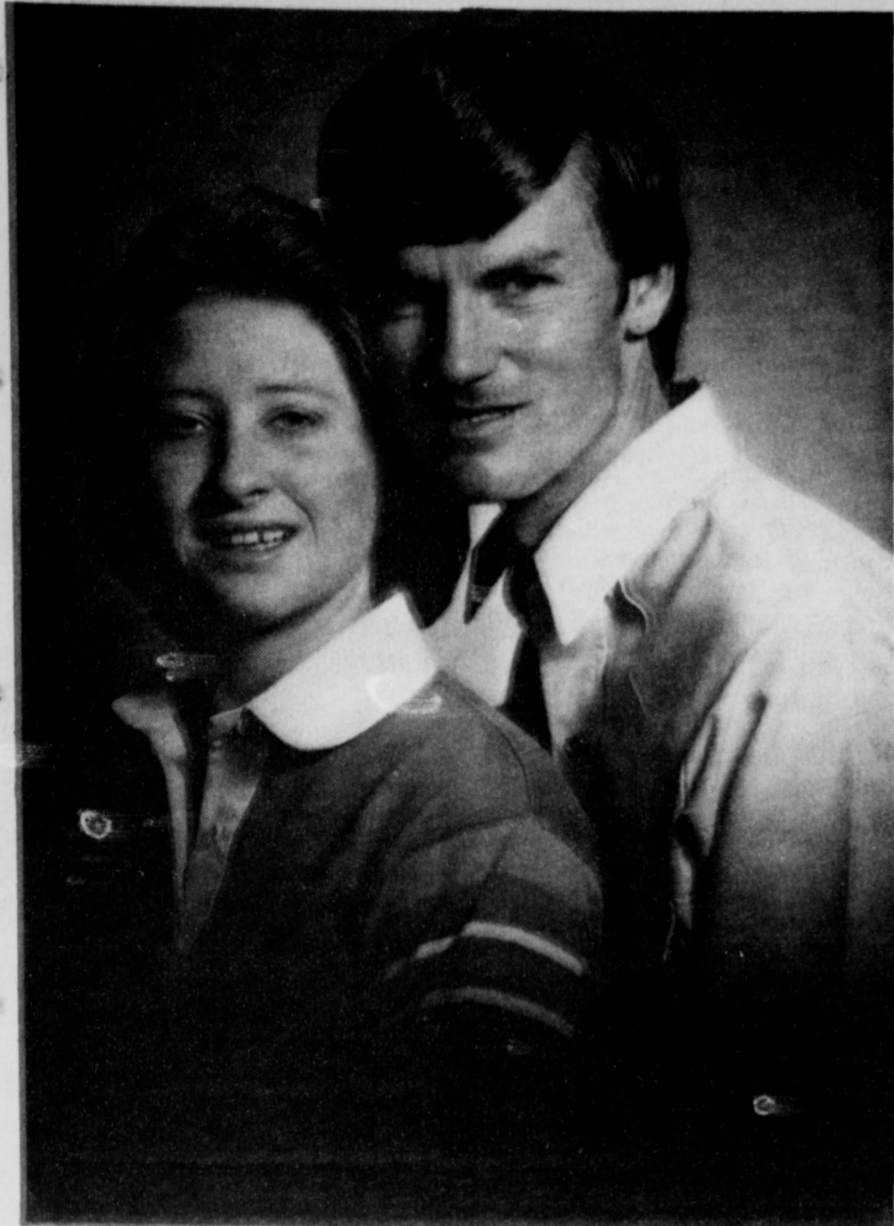

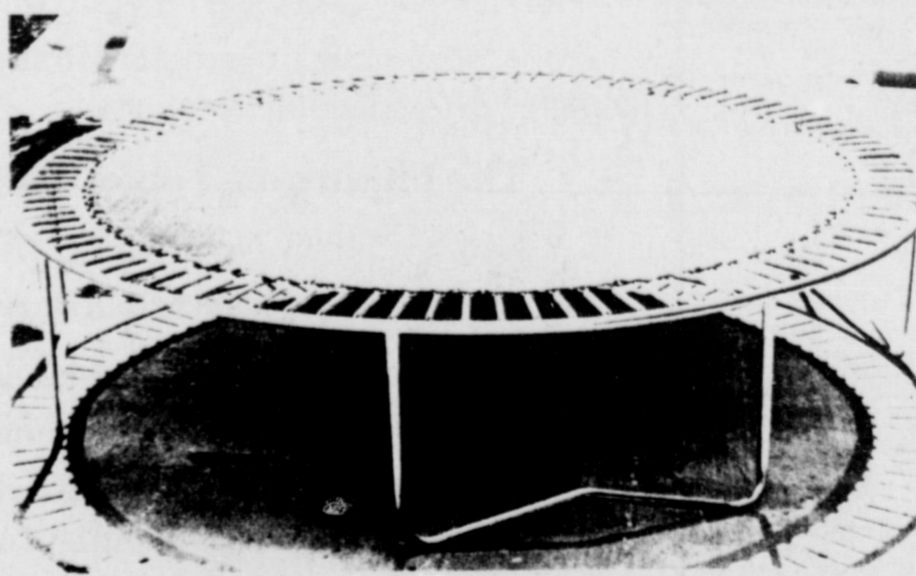

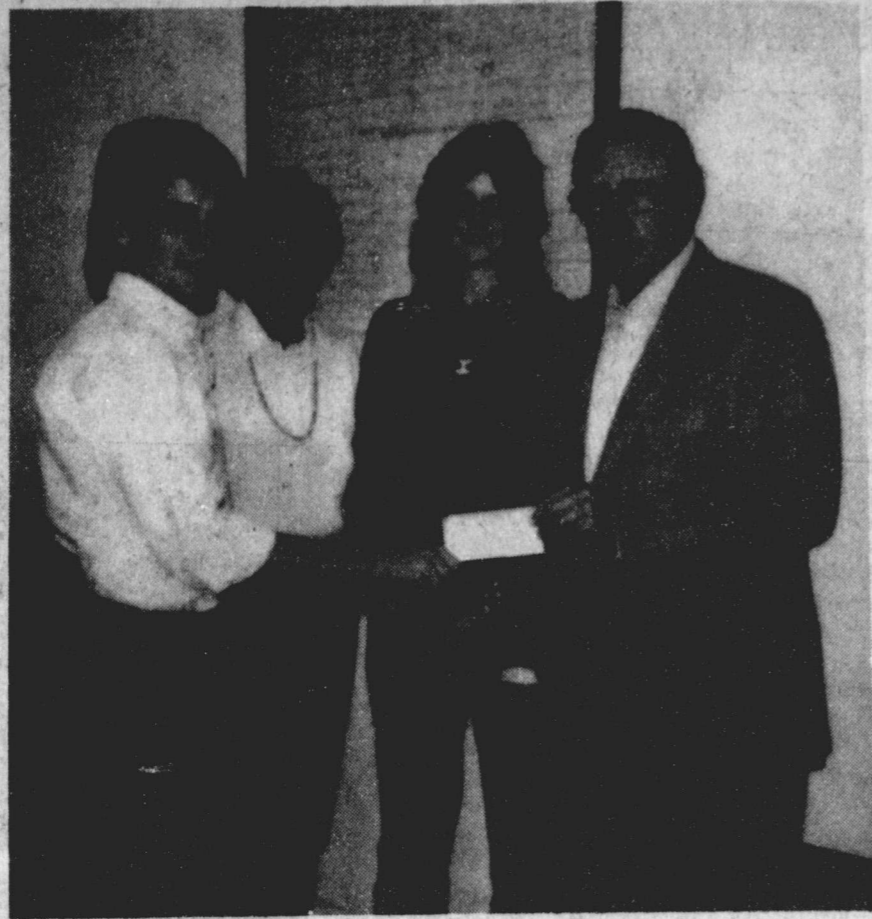

## Check Safety To Make The Holidays Bright



- Before hanging strings of lights, spread them on the floor and check for frayed or bare wires, cracked insulation, loose connections, and damaged plugs or light sockets.
- Check extension cords for wear or damage and don't run them across walking areas.
- Test lights before putting them on the tree. Unplug them before making repairs or replacing bulbs.
- Overloading circuits with too many lights can cause fire. Follow manufacturer's instructions about the number of lights allowed on one circuit.
- Choose a fresh, green tree, trim its base and keep it in plenty of water. If the needles are brown and break off easily, it could be a fire risk.
- If you buy an artificial tree, make sure it has been tested for flammability by Underwriters Laboratories (UL).
- Place your tree away from the fireplace or other heat sources and out of the traffic pattern.
- Never string lights on a metallic tree. Light strings with damaged insulation can electrically charge a metallic tree. Instead, shine unattached colored floodlights or spotlights on the tree.
- Always turn off lights before leaving home or going to bed. You'll save money and be safer, too.
- Never use lighted candles on a tree or near evergreens. And don't burn evergreens in the fireplace.
- Do not use inside lights on the outside. All outside lighting equipment, including lights, cords and plugs, should be waterproof and made for outdoor use. Also, hang sockets downward and don't leave a socket empty.
- When hanging lights on the rooftop or in tall trees outdoors, stay clear of electrical lines. Make sure you or your decorations don't come in contact with them.
- Should you receive a CB radio or television this Christmas, let a qualified serviceman install the CB base unit or television antenna for you. This delicate job is best left to the professionals.
- Be sure electrical toys are tested for safety. Look for the UL mark.

## Windbreak Planning Important

Trees can provide a lot of protection for those gusting winter winds, and the time to plan windbreaks is at hand. However, actual planting time won't be until late winter or early spring.

"A windbreak planting can provide a comfort and protection zone," points out Dr. Michael Walterscheid, forestry specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System. "Windbreaks also can be planted for livestock protection, wildlife habitats, Christmas tree production, fruit and nut production, and aesthetics."

Properly designed windbreaks

will provide full protection from wind to a distance of 10 times the height of the tallest trees and provide some protection out to 20 times the height of the tallest trees.

Density of windbreaks is also important, says Walterscheid. A moderately dense windbreak acts as a filter and allows for less turbulence on the inside of the windbreak. Not only do windbreaks affect wind velocity, but they can reduce mid-day summer temperatures up to 5 degrees out to 20 times the height of the windbreak.

To begin preparations for a windbreak, mow or plow the site in early fall to help reduce weed competition, suggests the specialist. If there is a chance of erosion, sow a cover crop during the winter, leaving a 2-foot-wide strip for the tree planting. Plow and disk the site again two to three weeks before planting. It is important to conserve soil moisture so seedlings will get off to a good start.

"When planning the wind-

break, remember to keep trees 100 feet from the nearest structure and extend it beyond the farmstead 100 feet," says Walterscheid. "If the windbreak is for livestock, it must be fenced for protection."

Many older windbreaks were planted with up to 10 rows of trees, which took lots of space, he notes. However, research has shown that three rows of

trees can be just as effective. Two rows should be conifers such as pine or juniper; the other can be hardwoods such as oak.

Never mix hardwoods in the row with conifers or mix various species of hardwoods in a row because of varying growth rates and crown shapes, cautions Walterscheid. Conifer rows should be at least 15 feet apart

and hardwood rows should be 20 feet from the conifers.

Trees for windbreak plantings are available from the Texas Forest Service. Landowners in the northwestern half of Texas should obtain trees from the Lubbock nursery; landowners from the southeastern part of Texas should order trees from the Alto nursery. Trees from the Alto nursery will be available

for planting in late December while Lubbock nursery trees will be available in March.

Walterscheid adds that using a drip irrigation system will increase tree survival and growth. More information on planning and planting windbreaks is available from county offices of the Extension Service or the Soil Conservation Service, he notes.
