## ROBERTS COUNTY GOOD ROAD DAY NAMED TUESDAY OF NEXT WEEK

At a meeting of citizens held yesterday the day for our good roads was set. Tuesday of next week, Sept. 26th is the day set, and it is hoped that every one will turn out well on that day and do a good days work on some public road.

The following overseers were appointed for the different roads leading out of town.

Judge L. C. Heare, North Plains road, Ben Talley, South Plains road, O. B. Hardin, Green Lake road and N. F. Locke, Canadian road.

These gentlemen will be ready to give information as to where to work, and will direct the work so that it is done the most effective way. Each man may go to work the road he is most interested in. Just any road that needs working. But be sure that you work some road, all day next Tuesday. Many of the farmers have agreed to join in this road movement, and it is hoped that every man in the County will spare this one day to help improve the public roads. Bring your team, scraper, shovels, pick, etc. Everything that can move dirt. We will have one of the biggest road workings this county has ever experienced. If we cooperate and do an honest days work, there is no telling how much good we can do.

## Little Elsie Johnston Dies Suddenly.

Little twelve year old Elsie Johnston, daughter of Mr. and Mrs Jim Johnston died at the family residence in Miami Tuesday morning. Death came very sudden, and just after her mother had given her a sup of water which she had asked for.

Her sweet little life had been hanging in a balance for near a year from that dreaded disease dropsy. She stood the suffering for many months without a murmur, and death must have been sweet, rather than be confined to bed in pain.

Funeral services were held at Mobeotic Tuesday evening, conducted by Rev. Wilsford, and the remains were laid to rest in the Mobeotic cemetery. A large number of Miami friends accompanied the body of the deceased to its last resting place, and a very large number of Mobeotic friends of the family gathered to pay their last respects to the little girl who had been raised in their midst.

## Water and Light Money Coming

The City Water and Light Warrants were shipped on Saturday and shipped to Austin with draft attached. A telegram from Austin Tuesday stated that everything had been examined and the warrants shipped to Cincinnati, with instructions to wire the money back, which looks like we will have the money in a local bank before another issue of the Chief comes out.

So far no contracts for work has been let, but we understand that bids for the work have already been offered and the contract is still being advertised. It will not be very long until we may see actual construction start on the system. One of the engineers remarked that we could have the light plant in operation in about two months after construction began, which looks like we might have the lights turned on for a Christmas surprise.

You cannot tell what is in the minds of people until an expression can be had. A year ago people laughed at a road bond issue or a water and light system. Now they are both realized, and that too with a very little opposition. Miami saw the need of roads, water and lights, went after them, and as is invariably the case, with co-operation has secured them.

The good roads meeting called at Amarillo for Wednesday was largely attended by representatives from all points on the line and as a result of that meeting an organization was formed bearing the title of the Amarillo-Higgins-Wichita Highway Association.

## Another Business Change.

A deal was closed yesterday evening, whereby Locke Bros. and C. C. Stockstill becomes owners of the Wells Bros and S. C. Osborne Dry Goods stores in Miami, and Wells Bros becomes owners of a section of fine South Plains land.

The stores will invoice over in something like 60 to 90 days and the new owners take charge, and by the way, would not attempt now to tell you who would be the owners in the next 30 days, judging the future by the past few weeks trading. However we are sure that if Messrs Stockstill and Locke takes charge, we will have two good stores. Wells Bros. have given nothing out yet as to what they will do, more than they will remain in Miami, which we are glad to state. They have been here for several years and made a good success of the dry goods business.

We feel proud of our prizes and aside from helping the Panhandle State Fair our part, we will receive much good results from the advertising of this display.

A movement is on foot to send this exhibit to Dallas to the State Fair. No decision has yet been made.

## Highway Association.

The following officers were elected: E. C. Gray, president; C. Coffee, vice pres, and E. B. Roberts, secretary and treasurer. The following board of directors were appointed: S. B. Vaughn, E. M. Congdon, E. W. Poteet, N. S. Locke, and B. F. Tepe.

The object of this association is to foster the building of good roads along the line of the Santa Fe between Amarillo and Wichita, Kansas. The proposed road will run through Panhandle, Pampa, Miami, Canadian, Glazier, Higgins, and from thence to Shattuck, Gage and Woodward and beyond.

It is proposed to log the road and place steel markers for the guidance of travelers. The next meeting of the board of directors will be at Miami on October 10.

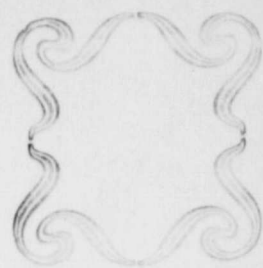
