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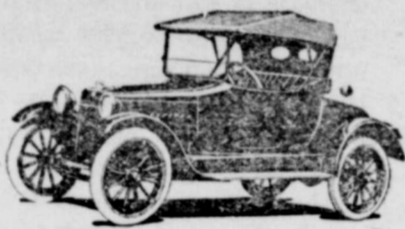

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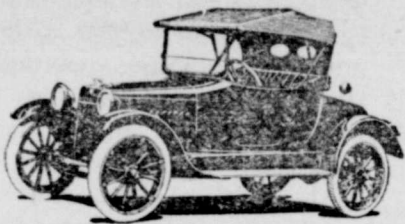

Lots of people are too busy to take advice, but we seldom see a man too busy to give it.

The fall of the year is a good time of the year to plant trees. Also the spring is a good time, and any other time of the year that they will live. The main thing is to plant trees.

The Lockney Beacon says: "Never leave a can of gasoline near a hot stove, or a bottle of whiskey near a booze fighter." Such advice as that is worth nothing. You couldn't leave either of them there for ten minutes if you wanted to.

A prominent Panhandle business man recently remarked that one good automobile Highway was worth as much as two railroads. Not quite we believe, but they are worth going after, just the same.

An examination of the tax rolls of Carson county showed that 70 per cent of the land owned in that county was by non resident land owners. These fellows bought it for speculation, and are holding it away from many actual farmers who would be glad to put it into cultivation.

If cotton continues to sell at 15 cents per pound, it is likely to be a close rival to wheat for making money. We never saw a farmer in the Panhandle try for any length of time that did not make money out of wheat, and it cotton will stay at 15 cents those poor fellows in the central part of the state will soon be riding in automobiles.

The reason we have none for this winter is because people failed to properly patronize last year's course as they should and the committee cannot afford to pay for a course themselves. In order to insure a good lyceum, people must buy season tickets. There may be a number or two that you do not care to hear, but of the course there will likely be one number worth the money.

Print paper still continues to go up. Over 100 weekly newspapers were suspended last month because of the price of paper. Hundreds of others newspapers are raising the subscription price to meet the extra cost, and we do not know exactly what the outcome will be. The Chief is going to remain at the \$1.00 per year mark as long as possible, but when the inevitable comes, well it is just here. A fellow can stand a loss for a time, but then there is an end to it.

It is interesting to know that in the state of Minnesota there lives an Indian who is now 128 years old. His photograph, as reproduced recently in a magazine, would indicate that he was even older than that, but still could live many years. He was born in 1778 in the wilderness of Minnesota. His real name is WA-BE-NE-GEW-WES, but the white man has named him John Smith. The old Indian still talks of the past and lives with a great grand son. He sells pictures of himself and answers questions for which the people traveling that way give him money.

It was the writers pleasure to travel over the public road leading north from the splendid little city of Shamrock recently. We have often wondered why so many automobiles were used over this piece of road and have now found out. It is so rough that a horse would fall and break his neck trying to travel it. Honestly we never traveled over rough mountain side or any where else as this road is for a few miles. An old timer of that town informed us that a man who had lots of nerve, and some what of a plunger decided he could solve the transportation problem over that road by shipping in a car load of mountain burros, but only three of them ever survived to make the round trip. Not only the south part of that county needs working, but a good investment of \$200,000 could be made for good roads in the entire county.

Traveling Library.

Traveling libraries are collections of 50 books which are sent by the State, and circulate through the library of the Texas Library and Historical Commission in the Capitol, free of all charge except the cost of transportation upon receipt and return of each library. The libraries are made up of the best popular books in English, for adults and children, approximately one-third of the books being juvenile books, travel, biography, science, and literature. The libraries are shipped in stout hinged cases and are accompanied by supplies necessary for keeping records of circulation.

The traveling libraries are intended for rural communities and small villages not enjoying public library privileges. When the people at a station have read a library, it is returned to the Commission, where the books are checked up, record of their circulation is taken, necessary repairs made and binding done, and then it is sent to another station.

To secure a traveling library for a rural community or a town too small to support a public library, or where it is at present impracticable to take advantage of the county library law, or where it is felt a traveling library will be of benefit in arousing interest in taking advantage of the county library law, at least two taxpayers and a banker guaranteeing the responsibility of the taxpayers should make application on the blank furnished by the Commission and select a responsible person to care for the library.

In case a woman's club borrows the library for the community, the application must be signed by three officers of the club, who will remain responsible for the books even if their term of office expires before the books are returned.

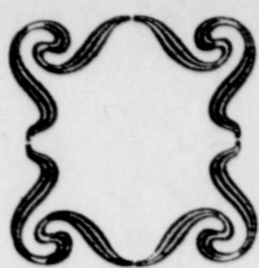

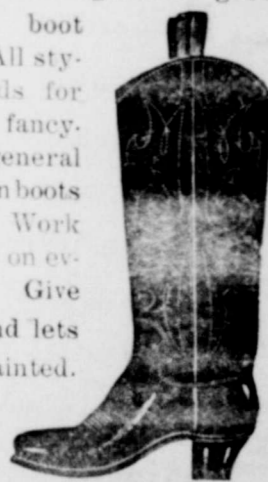
