## Commissioners Court.

The Honorable Commissioners court was in session Monday of this week. Grinding out the regular routine of business. W. F. Patton qualified as the new commissioner for this precinct. M. M. ## City Council Meeting.

The Miami City Council was in session Monday night of this week. Among other things they done was the signing up of all contracts recently made for our light and water system. They are pushing this along as fast as possible, but will now have to wait until the contractors fulfill their part of the work.

A question that come up before the meeting was filling the vacancy of Alderman Patton who resigned and qualified as County Commissioner. It is understood that a new councilman can not be appointed, but will have to be elected. If this be the case, and they cannot let the vacancy go unfilled until spring, an election will be called and another Alderman elected.

The Council also ordered a street grader, with the promise of six day deliver.

## New Garage Building.

Atty. J. A. Holmes began the erection of a new 50x80 foot iron garage between the Wagon Yard and Hickmans Hardware. When the building is complete, it will be occupied by the Miami Buick Agency, with W. J. Goffinet and T. R. Saxon as proprietors. They are preparing to put in an up-to-date machine shop and repair outfit, handle accessories, etc.

The building will be completed as soon as workmen can do the work and will be occupied at once. Our little city is getting a building on most every vacant lot, and in a very few more years, we will have to make Red Deer a little wider to hold our prosperous little town. We now have near 1500 people and the hollow is about full. But let them come. There is always room for good citizens to come and live in Miami.

## Auto Turns Over.

Saturday about noon Arthur Lyons was driving a Ford car near the Counts place on the South Plains and had started to town when one of the radius rods broke, turning the car over and landing it on top of him. As a result of the accident he came near losing his life. He managed to get from under the car before help arrived, and received four broken ribs, a fractured knee and arm and was severely bruised up otherwise. 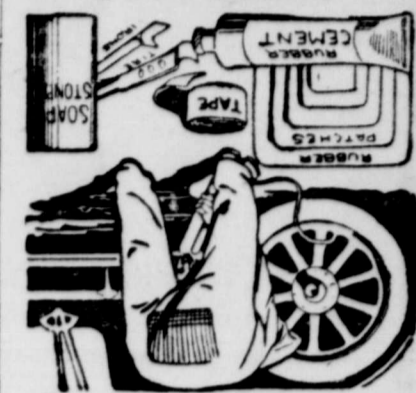

M. M. Craig and Fred Lee will "Keep House" this winter for Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Davis while they are in the south.

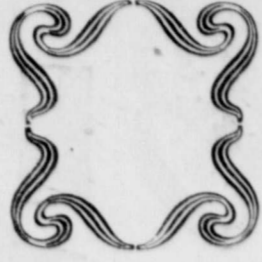
Mr. and Mrs. Ray Morrison returned Sunday evening from their trip to Kansas.

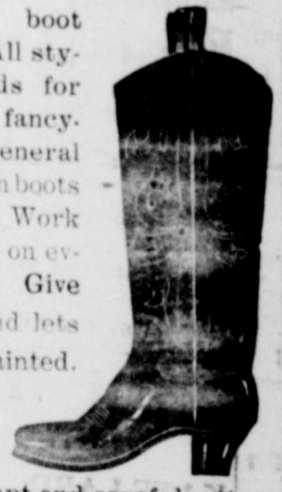

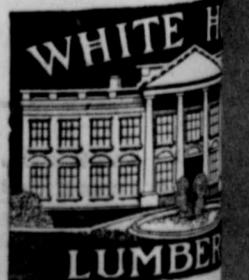
