City Council Let All Contracts

The City Council let the final contracts Monday for the complete construction of our water and lighting system. Thus when all contracts are completed, we will be ready to "Turn on the juice."

Mondays contract consisted of the power house, which is to be of brick, and 30x40 feet, and the tank which will be located on Mt. Moriah which will be 84 feet wide and twelve feet deep, with a capacity of 70,500 gallons. The last two contracts went to the Parker Muller Machinery Co. who also have other contracts for the city. The last named contract is to be completed in 60 working days, which will likely mean near Feb. 15th.

Communications from the engine people stated that the engines should be here this week. The foundations for them which is very large was completed to day and will be ready for the engines in about two weeks.

Jack Wright received the contract for digging the well and will begin work on it soon. The tower is already built.

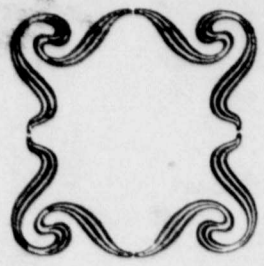

AT THE DIAL HOME.

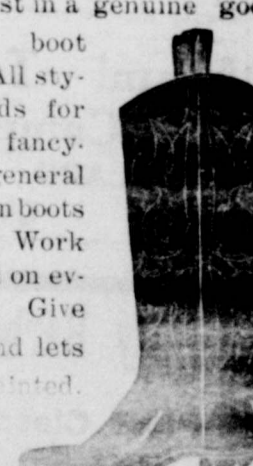

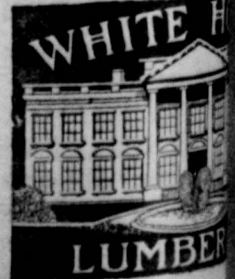
