

### OIL INDICATIONS STRONG

For 20 years it has been beleived by many that oil existed in various parts of New Mexico, especially in thevicinity of Alamogordo. In the enormous salt flats west of this city are found many indications that both oil and gas exist in this valley. Most noticable of these indications are the gas mounds, locally known as "The Twin Butte." Geologists who have visited these feilds are unanimously of the opinion that there are indica tions of oil and gas, and the beleif is unversal that when oil is struck many records will be broken in the gusher line, because of the terrific presure from below that is apparent along the syncline .- El Paso Herald.
