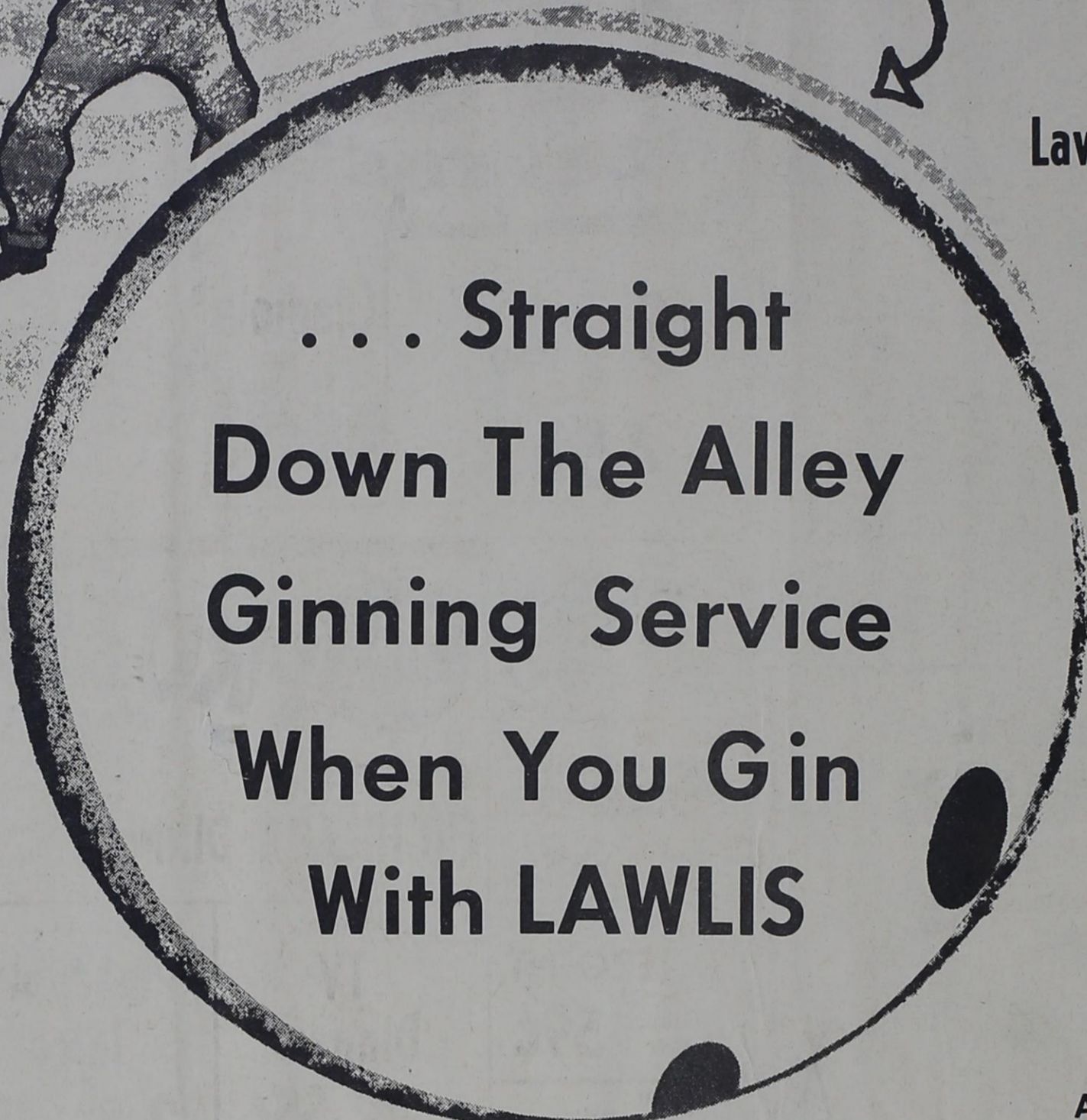
Thrifty Club With Mrs. Grissom

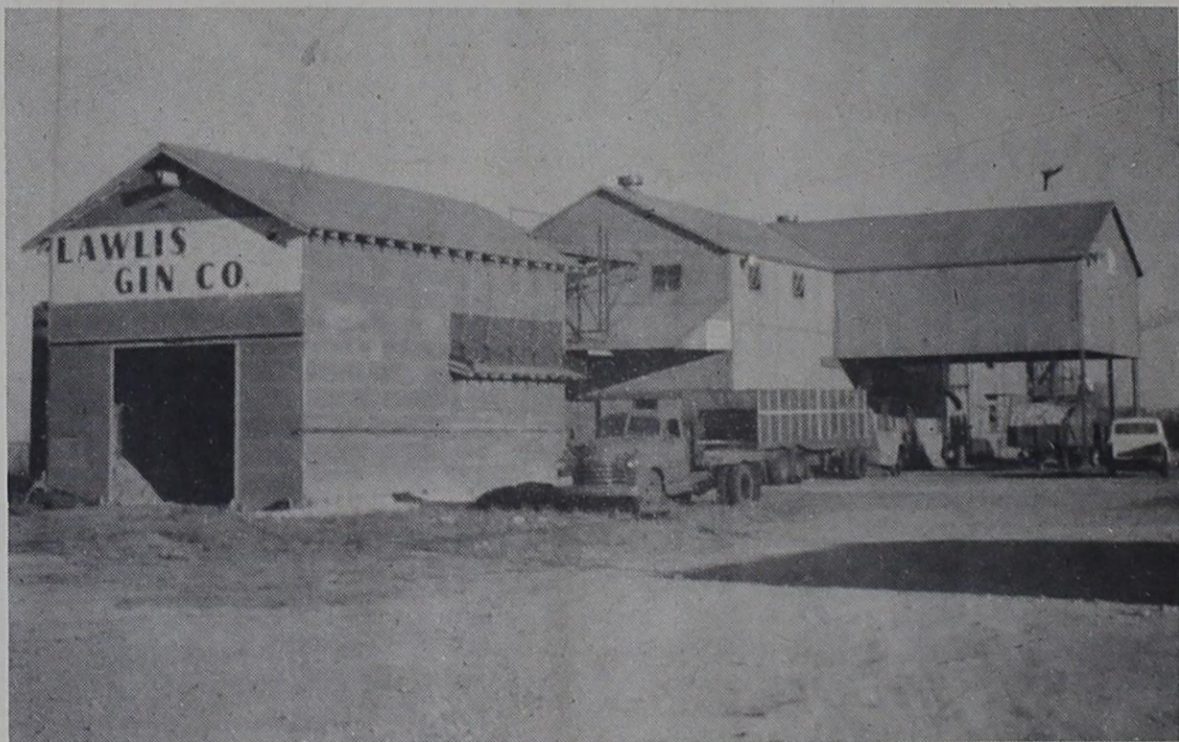
