In 1824 the present 'London Bridge' was built and in 1971, it City, Arizona in Lake Havasu The history of London Bridge is interesting and many stories have been written. In 1212, a disaster occured when a crowd of people
were trapped on the bridge between two fires and many burned to death. 1577, Nonesuch House was built to replace the drawbridge,
stretching across the bridge with a stretching across the bridge with a
tunnel running through it at street Fire again struck the bridge in 623. This was started when a servant left a pail of ashes under wooden stairs. Forty-three houses were destroyed and many of the
shops were also burned and
damaged. The merchants then damaged. The merchants then
began moving away from the bridge
as it was getting dilapidated. as it was getting dilapidated. By 1657, all the houses were
pulled down and the bridge was pulled down and the bridge was
widened and partly rebuilt with a widened and partly rebuilt with a
wide center arch. It stood like this for many years until 1831, when
the New London Bridge was ened. London Briage was built. onsider the condition of the bridge hat had been badly damaged by the Great Freeze, so it was decided to was finally put together and the overall dimensions were 928 feet ong and 49 feet wide. In 1902-04, it was once again widened and the otpath was widened to 15 feet. London Bridge was indeed 'falling down,' sinking into the Thames River because it was not adequate for the increase in traffic. Robert McCullough learned that the British up for sale and he submitted the winning bid for $\$ 2,460,000$. Plans were made to move the bridge and
reconstruct it in Lake Havasu City reconstruct it in Lake Havasu City
Arizona. Each piece was marked with four numbers and the first noted which row of stones and the last two numbers indicated which position in that row. It wa

bridge that there were code numbers on each stone when it was orginally on each

channel was dredged and water was hannel was dredged and water was diverted from the lake, under
bridge, then back into the lake. After the bridge was first taken apart, it was shipped by boa 10,000 miles to Long Beach, California. From there it was reconstruction began.
The bridge was completed and edicated on October 10, 1971 It was first decided that the property around the bridge would
probably be a retirement home and tourist site but it soon became city. There were 16,630 acres
purchased and 47 miles of shoreline which began a planned community and was designed as a self-
supporting city with a balanced supporting city with a balanced
economy based on industry, resort and recreation.
