## Bookmobile Program

 Faces TerminationFor several years a Bookmobile
Program has been operated in Program has been operated in the
four County area comprising Bailey Cochran, Lamb and Parmer Counties. The program has enjoyed public support during those years,
and has, in general, been very and has, in general, been very
successful. But it now appears that it will have to be phased out and
terminated about the end of this yearterminated about the end of this year-
-principally for economic reasons. -principally for economic reasons.
The Commissioner's Courts have, informally and reluctantly, agreed
that such action has become necessary.
In the past the participating counties have shared the operating expenses, with minor deviations, on a population basis. And the operation
budget for 1981 would require combinations as follows: Bailey, $\$ 6,095.25 ;$ Cochran, $\$ 4,353.75$;
Lamb, $\$ 10,594.12$; and Parmer $\$ 7,981.88$.
But recently the Lamb County withdraw from the program entirely and they did not include the

Hurricane Fredric. After evacuating his family to another city for safety, MSgt. Simmons returned to
Gulfport, Mississippi and worked
