## NEW EASTLAND BAKERY TO HOLD OPEN HOUSE ON THURSDAY, SEPT. 1

Eastland citizens will have an opportunity Thursday, Sept. 1, to inspect the Star Bakery, one of the city's newest businesses, at 215 West Main street when it holds open house beginning at 6 p. m.

The Star Bakery has been established in Eastland because Reese Allday, owner, well-known Eastland county citizen, recognizes this community as stable and holding great promise for the future.

Doughnuts and coffee have been prepared in great quantities as treats for those who visit the bakery and inspect its equipment, described as the most modern and efficient type. Cookies will be given to children.

J. R. Morgan, who is manager, stated that the bakery will center its interest on supplying Eastland with the most wholesome type of bread by which modern equipment and formulas may produce.

Sanitation will be one of the most observed points in the manufacture of Melo-O-Toast bread and other products of the Star Bakery, Morgan declared.

All types of pastries are to be made in the plant. They also will receive orders for special cakes and other bakery needs for special occasions.

Morgan, who has had 15 years experience, will also be head baker. He comes from Wichita Falls from the Star Bakery there where he had seven years experience.

His baking experience, however, has not been confined to Texas as he has also worked in states including Kansas and Oklahoma. Mr. Morgan is married and there are two children in the family.

W. C. Browning, formerly of Gorman, will be bookkeeper for the firm. He is married and there is one child in the family.

Leonard Trammell of Eastland, well-known in the city, will be salesman and assistant baker for the Star establishment. Trammell has been a resident of the city many years, taking active part in civic interests, including a long period as a member of the Knights of Pythias. Mr. and Mrs. Trammell reside in Eastland.

Morgan said the aim of the Star Bakery would be to provide the highest quality loaf on the market. Only the most healthful ingredients and trustworthy products are used in the bread and other products' manufacture, continued Morgan.
