



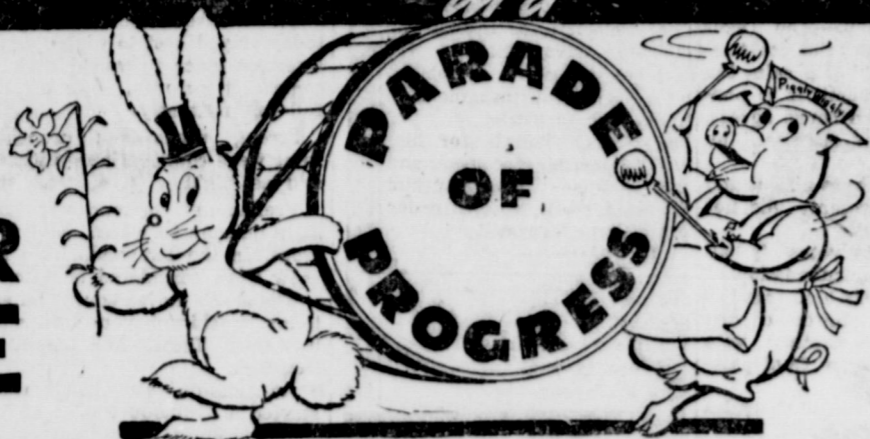

### Justice of Peace Recalls Instance Of 'Passing Beggar'

Justice of the Peace R. L. Wilson of Cisco, commenting on beggars in general and a few in particular with whom he has come in contact, relates the following incidents in the Cisco Press:

"Among the instances of social fraud recalled by Justice Wilson while he was a peace officer, was the case of a man picked up on the street here and found to have \$400 or more in currency and was several years ago when the more than \$37 in change. That picking was good, but it shows how one's sympathies may be wasted on the casual street beggar. The mendicant in this case was taken to the railroad station and his own funds used to purchase a ticket to the state line against his most vigorous protests. He wanted to go to Ranger.

"In a more humorous incident, Wilson recalls picking up an old woman here and discovered that Ranger officers had bought her a ticket to Cisco. Cisco officers promptly bought her a ticket back to Ranger. Ranger officers sent her back and Cisco returned the compliment. This amusing effort to 'pass the beggar' continued for some time."
