BRITAIN AND FRANCE
OFFER MILITARY AID
TO SMALL COUNTRIES

LONDON, April 13.—Great Britain and France today promised to fight any attack on Rumania or Greece and to resist with arms any attempt to change, by force the status quo in the Mediterranean.

In sweeping simultaneous declarations in London and Paris the two governments disclosed that fast action had blocked fascist threats to occupy the Greek island of Corfu and warned the dictatorships that their armed forces were ready to oppose any further aggression in Europe.

consider it vital to resist with their national forces, Great Britain would feel herself bound at once to lend those countries all the support within her power.

In Paris Premier Edouard Daladier made a similar declaration of policy, and reaffirmed France's military defense alliance with Poland.

Thus the two governments extended to Rumania and Greece the same military commitments which they had previously made to Poland.

The action in regard to Rumania and Greece came after the Bucharest Government had warned Britain in a strong message that she would be forced to swing closer to the nazis unless given assurance of British support. Greece also had appealed to London to know whether she could expect aid in event of attack and had negotiated for British and French naval cooperation in Greek bases.

Tolerance Is Not Only Right, It Is Good

America may well be proud that its very name is still almost another word for tolerance. The instinct to tolerate in others the freedom we expect for ourselves is deep in the American consciousness.

It is the very denial of these rights over many years that lies at the bottom of Europe's discontent. One racial minority, long suppressed and kept under, when it gets at last a chance to be on top, becomes equally oppressive of its former oppressors.

Tolerance has its positive side, more important than the negative. It lies in the fact that all races and all creeds have rich contributions to make to American civilization.

American life is rich and productive beyond anything that authoritarian states can ever achieve, simply because the way is wide open to all people to contribute their share.

Tolerance is not a burden, a source of weakness, grudgingly maintained because it is known to be right, but a source of strength, and a guarantee of the highest possible development of the nation of the future.

WASHINGTON.—A story of repression and denial of civil rights, as startling as anything told of Harlan county in its palmy days, will soon be laid before the country when the LaFollette committee submits its report on the Associated Farmers.

The Senate will be told that actually Associated Farmers is a "front" organization for railroads, public utilities, big business interests and large-scale landowners; that it is financed and dominated by those groups; that it operates to influence public opinion, to control the small farmer and to break up labor organization.

It is this last that has chiefly interested the committee investigators, and it is around this point that most of the charges against Associated Farmers hinge.

Government Employees Taxed.—The Supreme Court handed down an important decision in regard to taxation when it upheld the right of government to tax a Federal employee. This decision opened the possibility of new tax levies affecting the 3,700,000 Federal, State and local government employees. These employees have formerly been exempted.

Two-Power Pact May Anger Nazis

BERLIN, April 13.—The British-French pledge of aid to Rumania and Greece was regarded in well-informed Nazi sources today as certain to increase German anger and probably intensify the Nazi counter measures against "incitement" of the Reich.
