You can't order a chicken
fried steak at Holly's Cafe. fried steak at Holly's Cafe. Fried foods are not on the
menu. So if it's burgers and menu. So if it's burgers and
fries you crave, better crave somewhere else. Holly Smith
soesn't have a doesn't have a deep-fryer in
her place. her place.
Thanks to some financial help from the Friona Economic Development Corp.
(FEDC) and some business advice from the WTAMU Small Business Development Center in Canyon Holly
Smith has opened what she Smith has opened what she
describes as a healthy cafe. describes as a healthy cafe.
If you have stopped by and seen the cinnamon rolls, brownies, and the lusty cakes
and desserts, you might be and desserts, you might be
inclined to wonder just how
healthy healthy an upside down
carrot cake with cream, can be. That means no fried eggs
and bacon for breakfast. The and bacon for breakfast. fruit French toast, or pastries. The oatmeal special is a bowl of old-fashioned oatmeal
served with sliced apples served with sinced apples,
banana, raisins, walnuts, brown sugar, and milk or
cream. It's enough to make a sausage and hash brown cowboy run back to the truck. I couldn't help but notice
that Holly's Cafe was written that Holly's Cafe was written
up in an article in the up in an article in the week. Maybe you read it If you read it, did you wonder what a panini sandwich on a focaccia roll
was? You probably do what was? You probably do what
people do sometimes when people don't want to appear less than educated and
worldly. worldly.
Throw in a little pesto sauce and creamy cilantro sauce and creamy cilantro
dressing, topped off with a cup of cafe au lait or Chai tea and you can have a
thoroughly confusing lunch at Holly's for under $\$ 10$.
She might even throw in a Viscotti cookie to dunk in
your latte or mocha. I stopped by this week for a little research to assist you
with menu inte: pretation with menu inte pretation.
This way you can order with some self-confidence. We'll keep it simple.
Focaccia is an Italian flat bread roll with herbs in it
(healthy). A panini sandwich healthy). A panini sandwich
chicken sandwich served on a
focaccia roll.
Panini is the name of the Panini is the name of the grill it is cooked on. In other
words, a panini is an Italian stove. See, you can't just order a panini sandwich
becasue there is no such thing as ordering a panini. You've got to put the
focaccia on the panini first focaccia on the panini first,
then add the good stuff later then add the good stuff later.
Got the picture? Now there is Go need to embarass yourself
when you order when you order.
This summer you will find the entire Smith family working at the little yellow and blue cafe on Main Street.
