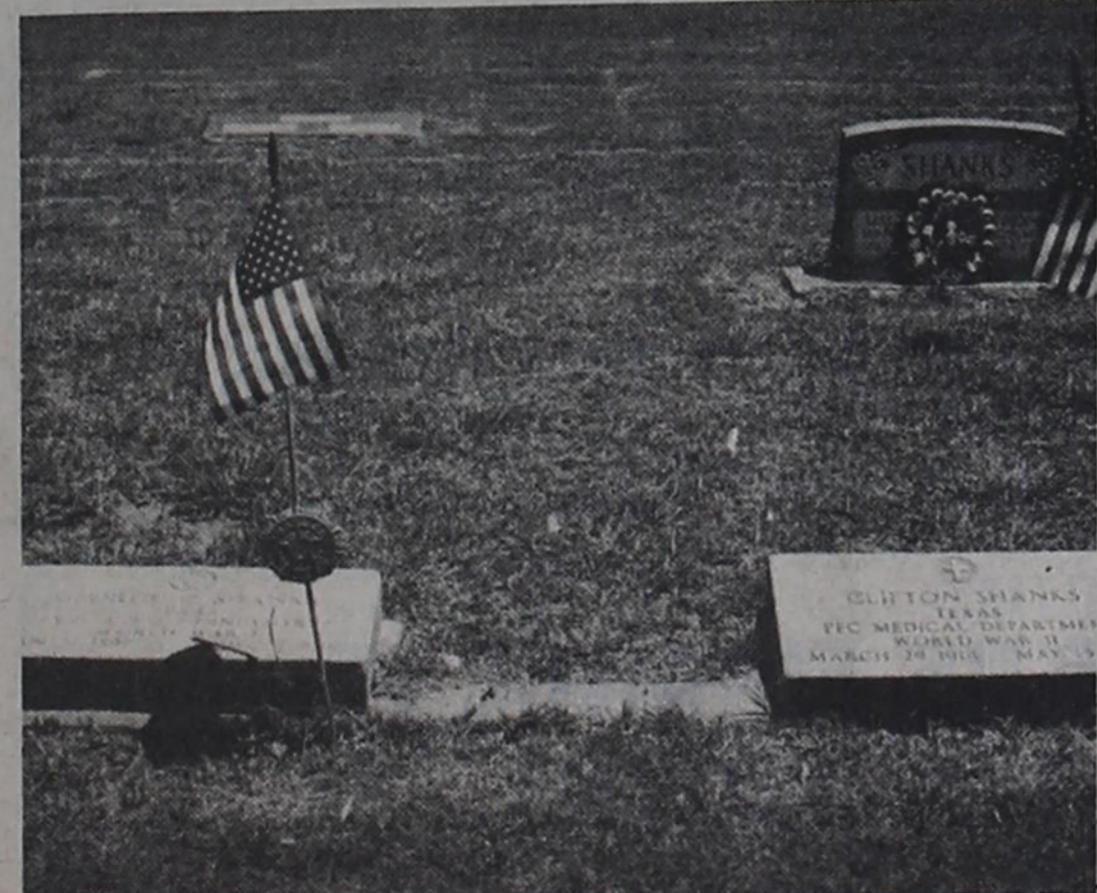

Superintendent Owen will introduce the speaker, Reverend Clark Williams, minister of the Bovina Church of Christ, who will present the sermon.

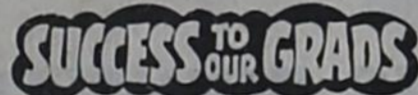
Honor guards for the class of 1985 will be Blake Sudderth and Irma Garcia.

Friena Industries' Merger Plan Aided

Friena Industries, Inc. and Eller Enterprises announced today that CHS Holding, Inc. has agreed to purchase the 592,525 shares of Friena common stock now held by David Eller and Eller Enterprises, Inc. for \$19.00 per share on or before June 20, 1985.

Friena Industries agreed to reimburse Eller Enterprises for certain expenses relating to Eller Enterprises' efforts to acquire F-I, and Eller and Eller Enterprises agreed to vote their shares of Friena common stock for the merger of CHS and Friena Industries.

Eller Enterprises also agreed not to purchase any shares under its tender offer for F-I, and, upon CHS' purchase of Eller's and Eller

Enterprises' shares, to withdraw the tender offer and dismiss its lawsuit against Friena Industries, CHS and their affiliates.

CHS and Friena Industries have agreed to rescind CHS's acquisition of Friena's Hi-Pro Feeds division, which occurred last Monday.

According to Ron Davenport, Friena Industries' chief executive officer, the settlement reached by CHS and Eller removes the remaining obstacles to consummating the merger of CHS and F-I. As previously announced, Friena Industries expects to mail proxy materials to its shareholders to vote on the merger as soon as SEC clearance is obtained.

Loan Rate Announced For County's Wheat

Parmer County farmers may obtain price support loans on their eligible 1985 wheat at a rate of \$3.29 per bushel, and barley for \$2.12 per bushel.

ASCS official Martin L. Chandler says the rates vary from county to county in relation to

cash prices, production and consumption.

The wheat loan rate is for wheat grading number one or better. The barley loan and purchase rate is for barley grading number two or better.

The price support loan program serves as a marketing tool for farmers by enabling them to take advantage of any increase in market prices at a later time.

Ex-Resident Hospitalized, Sister Dies

Billy Shepherd, 45, a former Bovina resident, suffered a severe concussion when he fell from a truck while he was on the job in Amarillo last Thursday, May 23. He is listed in serious condition and is in the ICU-unit at Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo.

Billy's sister, Martha, 42, of Dallas was in Amarillo to see her brother and while she was in the hospital she suffered a fatal heart attack. Services will be held at the Bovina First Baptist Church on Wednesday of this week.

Martha and her husband worked for several years on the Marion Carson farm. She was survived by three daughters and five grandchildren.

Tips Given On Lightning Safety

When it comes to a brilliant display of lightning in Texas skies, "better safe than sorry," is a good motto.

Deaths from lightning may be rare, but it's shortsighted for anyone to ignore the simple precautions and slight inconvenience of safety measures, says Texas A&M University Agricultural Extension Service health education specialist Dr. Mary Ann Heussner.

She says the first rule of lightning safety is to get away quickly from any open space—a field, golf course, hill-top, beach or pool. Get away before the rain

starts, since lethal bolts sometime strike during the muggy lull before a storm.

"If you're caught outside, the best kinds of shelter are buildings equipped with a lightning protection system, steel-framed buildings, and cars, buses or tractors with metal tops and closed windows," advises the specialist. "But don't trust a flimsy shelter on a golf course."

When you can't take cover, you can better your chances by taking refuge in a ravine, culvert or ditch—keeping away from pipes and staying alert for flash floods," Heussner says.

When none of this is practical, crouch as low as possible with no part of your body except knees and toes touching the ground. Also remember to avoid tall isolated objects, like a lone tree, staying twice as far away as the tree is high.

Just being indoors doesn't entirely protect you from lightning, Heussner points out.

Stay away from open doors and windows, fireplaces, radiators, stoves, metal pipes, sinks, bathtubs, shower stalls and plugged-in appliances. Electricity of lethal strength can enter a home not only by a direct strike, but also by a side flash from another object like a tree, and through pipe lines and wiring.

"Unfortunately, when someone is struck by lightning, bystanders often don't know what to do," remarks the specialist. "Others won't touch the victim for fear he is still electrically charged."

But a lightning victim can be safely touched, and often revived by mouth-to-mouth resuscitation," Heussner says.

Adults who work outdoors or enjoy outdoor sports may have a healthy respect for lightning, but children are often unaware of its danger. The specialist recommends that parents review lightning safety precautions with their youngsters along with safe bicycling and swimming rules for the summer.

- Do not set ladders or scaffolds near power lines.
- Do not shoot at insulators on poles, towers or structures.
- Never climb on or go inside a substation fence. Call SPS to help you retrieve anything thrown into the substation or caught in its fence.
- Avoid using electrical tools like lawn mowers or hedge clippers when grass and leaves are wet.
- Be careful when digging. Call SPS to find out if there are any buried electrical lines in the area.
- Electrical cords should not be spliced or taped. Repair by shortening them or replace them entirely.
- Beware of exposed wires.
- Don't touch portable appliances (coffee makers, radios, hair dryers, etc.) with wet hands or while standing or sitting in water.
- Don't post signs on utility poles. A lineman hitting a nail with his cleat could slip and fall. Also, nails can snag protective gloves and destroy their insulation value.

New Pesticide Rule In Effect

The spring planting season is underway in various stages across the state, and that means weeds and bugs, and the pesticides we must have to fight them, won't be far behind. The Texas Department of Agriculture wants to remind all farmers and ranchers new pesticide standards designed to protect the health and safety of all Texans, especially rural Texans, went into effect January 21st, along with a 90 day moratorium on penalties against inadvertent violators.

The section on notifying neighbors before spraying a field immediately adjacent to their property applies to aerial applications only, and prior notification is required only when the neighbor requests it. In addition, persons with medical conditions which may be made worse by exposure to pesticides and who live within one quarter mile of the field to be sprayed by an airplane can also request prior notification. Their request must be verified by a licensed physician, and certified by TDA. And certain institutions such as hospitals, nursing homes, schools when children are present, in patient clinics, licensed day care centers and farm labor camps, all within one quarter mile of the field to be sprayed by an airplane, can also qualify for prior notification.

Prior notification is to be given the day before the spraying and can be accomplished with a phone call, a post card, or a personal visit. Those farmers and ranchers with a number of neighbors requesting prior notification can use a flag to notify them.

In the rare case in which an emergency application is required, the application can still be made. However, notice must be given before the application and attempts to notify medically affected neighbors must be made at least one hour before the application.

The other section establishes re-entry intervals which define the amount of time which must lapse before a worker may render a treated field with normal work clothes. This section applies only when the farm worker is expected to have substantial body contact with the crop, but it does cover both aerial and ground applications.

The easiest thing to do is simply keep all farm workers out of the

field until the re-entry interval has expired, in almost all cases between 24 and 48 hours, and all the requirements have been met.

If the workers must enter a "hot" field, re-entry signs with the universal symbol and the name and phone numbers of the farm operator must be posted. In addition, the farm workers must wear the appropriate protective clothing, be told they cannot enter the field without appropriate protective clothing, be told when the re-entry interval expires, and be given a number of health related instructions.

This information can be given in person, in writing, or on warning signs posted beside the re-entry signs.

Other youngsters from the Baptist and Church of Christ also gave a helping hand throughout the day.

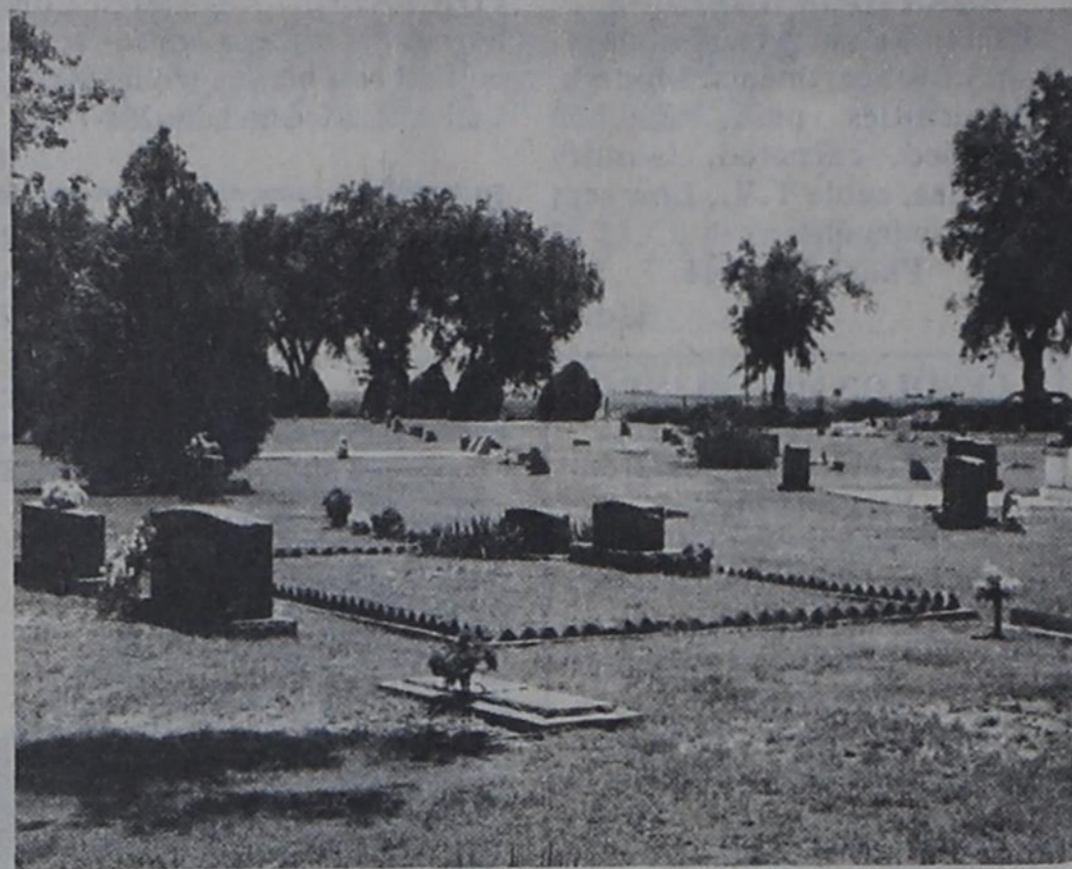
