In the rare case in which an emergency application is required, the application can still be made. However, notice must be given before the application and attempts to notify medically affected neighbors must be made at least one hour before the application.

The other section establishes reentry intervals which define the amount of time which must lapse before a worker may render a treated field with normal work clothes. This section applies only when the farm worker is expected to have substantial body contact with the crop, but it does cover both aerial and ground applications.
