Electricity And Ice Short As September Heat Hangs On

The prolonged September heat wave that has set new weather records in the Southwest had Eastland as well as other towns and cities in the grip of an ice and electricity shortage this week. Ice was the shortest, with the only local ice house running out most days at an early morning hour. Ice sold here has been brought usually from Weather ford.

The City Commission Monday night discussed inviting an Abilene firm to open an ice making plant here.

The electrical shortage just "crept up" on the power companies of the Southwest, which had no reason to expect such a belated Coach Johnny Little, is expected hot spell that kept air conditioning and refrigeration motors run ning overtime, said W. The life of Darvin Doyle of Ciseo, whose arm was torn off north of Eastland on the Breckenridge Highway last Thursday night

by a hit-run truck that sideswiped his car, likely was saved by B. T. Fagan of Eastland.

Fagan came along after the accident and applied a tourniquet to Doyle's bleeding stump. The severed arm was found on the highway 15 miles toward Breckenridge from the scene of the accident.

Fagan then took Doyle to a Breckenridge hospital, where he began his recovery.
