Tips Are Given On Cold-Related Injuries

The recent cold wave and the fac that November is here seems to herald the coming of winter. Here are a few timely hints about

cold-related injuries from paramedic Don Spring of Bovina.
A severe and dangerous coldrelated condition is frostbite. This condition is rare in the Panhandle and usually occurs in the elderly
person who is outdoors, and for person who is outdoors, and fo
whatever reason is unable to make it back inside to warmth.
"As the tissue, usually in the
extremities, freezes, the cells rupture extremities, freezes, the cells rupture and the blood vessels seal off so there
is a double trauma situation present. The cells, deprived of oxygen from the blood, shortly begin to die and the area takes on a dark splotchy blue or black color," Spring said. "Remember, anyone suffering frostbite is assumed to be
hypothermic, suffering from low hypothermic, suffering from low
body temperature. It is vitally important to warm the whole body, so get the patient to a place of warmth immediately. Until emergency aid arrives, it is advisable to warm the affected area in water at
$100^{\circ}-105^{\circ}$. Remember!! Never, never, massage the area to restore
rubbing the friction caused by rubbing the area only further the condition ", Sprill wall and worsens Ife condition,"' Spring warns.

through seventh level. Learning 100 is organized into learning units called cycles of instruction. A cycle of
instruction is a carefully planned instruction is a carefully planned
sequence of learning activities which introduce vocabulary, concepts, and skills, and provides instruction, evaluation, reinforcement and extension. Students are entered into the program at their own level of ability as established by various testing
methods. Auto-instructional and methods. Auto-instructional and
audio-visual techniques such as the audio-visual techniques such as the
combo-eight reader, cassette tapes DuKane reader and an Apple II
computer program, increase both involvement and learning time fo each student by permitting him/her to respond to every question and
exercise, and by furnishing immediate exercise, and by furnishing immediaale
reinforcement. Many of the materials reinforcement. Many of the materials
and techniques are self-pacing so that each student can progress at a suitable rate. Selections include information in the areas o
economics, arithmetic, social studies and science as well as everyday living and reading enjoyment.
