## THE ENTIRE NATION has bee

 in a state of shock this week, due to the untimely explosion duringthe launch of the space shuttle Challenger, which cost the lives of Challenger, which cost the lives of
the six astronauts and the teacher.
The tragedy seemed to have been compounded somewhat due to the extra attention given this particular
launch, with the inclusion of launch, with the inclusion of
Christa McAuliffe, who was the first teacher included on a shuttle launch.
The mishap was witnessed by millions of Americans on live television, including younsters in
Mrs. McAulife's school in New Hampshire. This proved to quite a traumatic experience for
not only these youngsters, but for others across the country.
And as the investigation into the cause of the explosion continues, need for manned space probes, when the loss of life is a distinct possibility.
Personally, we have always
admired the space program and admired the space program and our nation has derived from the program, in the case of advanced lechology which has given us everything from micro-computers
to solid-state television which arely ever needs a repairman. Medical technology has also been great beneficiary echnological advancement emming from the space program. Have you thought about th ninth year since launch? The TV cameras aboard Voyager have sent back our most comprehensive photos of the planets Jupiter, Saturn and Uranus.
Not only do you have to applaud the technology which brought
about the spacecraft's rendezvous with Uranus, a distance of three billion miles, but the very fact that the space probe's television camera is still clicking away, and that the
Jet Propulsion Laboratory's "TV receivers" from this great distance have functioned with such
perfection. Of course, the Voyager's success
speaks well for the unmanne speaks well for the unmanned portion of our space program, but
there have been many experiments and discoveries connected with the program which would not have been possible withoul the Manned Space Program.
If we had let th
If we had let the earlier tragedy were killed on the launch pad, to have ended the manned program, our nation never would have landed men on the moon. This
success was a springboard to success was a springboard to the
nation's current impressive space record.

We would hope that NASA
officials will soon be able to pinpoint the cause of the explosio so the shuttle
resumed quickly
One of the side affects of the current "hold" on the launches will be that we will miss the chance
for the shuttle astrons and photograph Halley's Stuet and photograph Halley's Comet,
which was to have been a projec of a March launch.
This would have given the world
its best pictures its best pictures and data on the
comet, which is yd comet, which is yet to reach its
zenith, with the addition of its tail zenith, with the addition of its tail
after it circles the sun. Participants in the space
program are well aware of the dangers involved. They know that for a mission to succeed,
everything must function like
clockwork. Various members of
the program have mentioned the fact that they had been "prepared" for such a tragedy as happened this week, due to the fact
