Applications for emergency
farm loans for losses caused by hail, high winds, drought, excessive rainfall and abnormally
low temperatures are being low temperatures are being
accepted at the Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) office located in Farwell, FmHA county supervisor Weldon C. Rainey said this week.
Parmer
Parmer County is one of 15 in
Texas recently named by Secretary Texas recently named by Secretary
of Agriculture Richard Lyng as eligible for loans to cover part of actual production losses resulting from the drought.
Weldon C. Rainey said farmers may be eligible for loans of up to
80 per cent of their actual losses, or the operating loan needed to continue in business, or $\$ 500,000$,
whichever is less. For whichever is less. For farmers
unable to obtain credit from unable to obtain credit from private commercial lenders, the
interest rate on the first $\$ 100,000$ borrower is 5 per cent; interest rate is 8 per cent on the balance borrowed over that amount. For farmers who can obtain
commercial credit but who choose to borrow from FmHA, the interest rate is 12 per cent. As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30 -per cent loss of production to be eligible for
an FmHA emergency loan, Rainey said. Farmers participating in the PIK or federal crop insurance programs will have to figure in proceeds from those programs in
determining their losses determining their losses.
Applications for loans under accepted until December 3, 1986, but farmers should apply as soon as possible. Delays in applying could create backlogs in processing and possible carry over into the
new farming season, Rainey said. FmHA is a credit agency of the U.S. Department of Agriculture. It is authorized to provide disaster emergency loans to recognized farmers who work at and rely on

## Sesquicentennial Notes

 A Member Of The Bovina Sesquicentennial Committee (Continuing the history ofBovina Schools from research Bovina Schools from research
done by Mrs. W.O. Cherry for a Master's Thesis:)
"In 1932 after a two-year stay superintendent, Warren left and Mr. O.L. Smith took his place. There were ten teachers on the faculty; seven who held bachelor's degrees, two had 3 years college years college work. The superintendent's salary was $\$ 1800$, the principal's $\$ 900$, while the average teacher received $\$ 765$.
Two hundred sixty-nine children Two hundred sixty-nine children were enrolled, with sixteen
graduating from the 4 -year partially accredited high school. The full impact of the depression was beginning to be felt and there was not enough money to pay the in A and B warrants. The A warrants were payable on demand, and the B's drew 6 percent interest. These warrants the teachers would discount at almost any price. On May 31 , 1933, a bond
assumption election was held which made the entire district responsible for taxes.
In January, 1933, Smith was reelected with a reduction in pay.
The entire faculty was re-elected in March with salaries cut 25 percent. They were willing to take the reduction in order to be paid in cash. There were 252 students with from the 11th grade. Smith and all $t$
rehired for the school year, 1934 35. Four new International buses were purchased in 1934. Nine more town lots were bought to enlarge
the playground. Later the lots were needed for a football field.
In April, 1935, Mr. Smith was elected for the fourth time with a salary increase to $\$ 1800$. In August c.C. Ward was elected bus
caret. He held that position until August, 1949.
In February, 1936, Smith was re-elected, but realizing he faced some opposition he exchanged places with W.O. Cherry of
McAdoo. Cherry would maintain his position for 13 years. Cherry was successful in calming the tax and valuation problem, handing busing difficulties, and settling the problem of under
Cherry asked the board to r elect the 1935-36 faculty and to install a telephone at the school He recommended the installation distribution system, the purchase of a duplicating machine, and the construction of a home for the superintendent. He instigated the collection of delinquent taxes
which brought in the needed revenue. By February, 1937, a new ive-room modern stucco house was completed and ready for the superintendent and his family. The total cost was $\$ 2500$.

In February, 1938, Cherry was elected for a two-year term.
