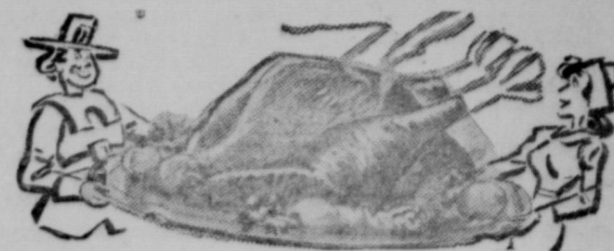
Of course her favorite teacher is "Teach" Johnson and if she likes "Teach" her favorite subject is almost bound to be English.
