



AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION Of the State of Texas, to be Voted on Tuesday, November 6, A. D. 1900.

[H. J. R. No. 35.]

JOINT RESOLUTION, amending Article 8, of the Constitution of the State of Texas, by adding thereto Section 20, providing for the organization of irriga-tion districts, and for the levying and collection of a tax for the construction of reservoirs, dams and canals

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas. That Article 8, of the Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended by adding therato Section 20, as follows

Section 20. In addition to the powers of taxation granted in the foregoing sections, it shall be lawful for the Legislature of Texas to authorize the land owners of the counties of Archer, Baylor, Clay, Wichita and Knox to organize irrigation districts in said counties without regard to county lines.

In making provisions for the cost of construction of irrigation works within said territory, it shall be lawful to levy taxes and create an indebtedness to rest as a to levy taxes and create an indeptedness to test as a charge on and be secured by a lien on the irrigable land for the use and benefit of which said irrigation works have been or may be constructed. The Legislature may authorize such taxes and indebtedness as may be nece sary to construct irrigation works within said territor but no taxes shall be levied nor indebtedness created, any district until authorized by a two-thirds vote of resident land owners therein whose lands are suscep

of irrigation from the proposed works. The Gov paor is hereby directed to issue the n sary proclast qualified vo first Monday J votors four submitting this smendur ut 1900, at which first Monday J voters favorin printed on the Constitution of irrigation distric Knox counties," and shall have written or pr amending Article 8, of to permit the formation Baylor, Clay, Wichita a
