Store Sales Up

DALLAS, Tex. Oct. 22 (UP) The Federal Reserve Bank's weekly report on department store ales in four major cities released today showed Houston far in front with a 29 per cent gain over the corresponding week a year ago.

Houston likewise had a 32 per cent gain for the two weeks period ending Oct. 16 as compared with a year ago and 30 per cent increase for the four weeks.

District sales were up eight per cent for the week, 13 per cent for two weeks and nine per cent for four weeks.

RUSSIAN REQUEST FOR VOTE DELAY ON COMPROMISE PROPOSAL GRANTED

New Well Flows 75 Barrels In Three Hours

A well with a flow that would rival some of the "gushers" for which the boom was famous nearly 30 years ago has been comple ed in the Kleiner pool.

In the first three hours, the well flowed 75 barrels. This was through a choke, 24-64ths of an inch, in contrast to the wide-open flow of the old-time gushers.

The well is the Lone Star Pro ducing Company's Kincade A-5 and is producing from the Mississippi lime. The remarkable thickness of this formation in the Kleiner pool is again evidenced by this produc er which found the top of the Miss sissippian at 3,711 and the stratum extended to 4,067, a thickness of 356 feet. The well was perforated in only a portion, of course, this tremendous section, the per forations being from 3,915 to 4,




