Leon Grissom of Bovina, was killed in a frear accident involving a feed mix truck about $7: 30$ a.m.
Thursday at Grissom's farm south of Bovina.
Pedro Arquelles, also an em-
ployee of Grissom, was loading the ployee of Grissom, was loading the
truck with ensilage at the time of the accident. He had left Cruz sitting in the truck and told Grissom he had no Idea why Cruz
had gotten out of the vehicle. Arquelles found Cruz underneath the truck where, apparently, a
set-screw on the power take off had set-screw on the power take off had
struck the man on the back and left struck the man on the back and left
side of the head. Cruz was blind in the left eye. The set screw extended out about one-half inch from the
