



Fishermen who have been plagued with a number of special licenses as they fished from county to county will need only one license over the state.

Texans over 17 must have a Universal Fishing License regardless of where they fish.

When using live bait, anglers must have a license if fishing outside the county of residence. Under the law, fishermen using

Persons holding commercial fishing licenses are exempt from obtaining a Universal Fishing License for fresh water fishing. All persons under 17 are exempt from holding a license.

The Universal License entitles Texans to fish anywhere in the state. However, if they cross the Oklahoma line on Lake Texoma, they must have a special uniform license enacted by the legislatures of the two states.

The Texoma license, the Texas Game, Fish and Oyster Commis-sion decided at its July meeting,

ORANGE, Tex, Aug. 13 (UP) A fire that destroyed three buildings and injured four persons in the Gulf Coast city was estimated today to have done \$300,000 damage.


