island Fortress of Formosa. Chiang left Chengtu this morn ing in his personal plane as Communist forces closed in on the Nationalists' last mainland capital from three directions. Communist capture of Chengtu was

expected in a day or two. The cabinet, meeting in an extraordinary session last night, agreed to remove the seat of government from Chengtu to Formosa. It also created two Guer-
