Expenditure Of \$5,500 Voted For Project, Work To Start Soon

An expenditure of \$5,500 to make possible closure of the disposal plant south of the city, one of Eastland's worst health hazards, was approved by the City Commission in a regular meeting Thursday night.

An automatic pump and sump will be installed at the south disposal plant and 3,300 feet of pipe laid to the east plant, where another automatic pump will be placed to take care of the extra raw sewerage.

Following purchase of necess-ary equipment and supplies, work on the project will begin as soon as possible, a city spokesman stat-

Termed "nothing more than an open cess pool," closure of the south disposal will eliminate not only the odor in that area, but also seepage into the Texas Electric Company Power Plant lake. In past years, the sewer seepage into the lake has made the fish undesirable for consumption and has curtailed other recreational

With installation of an automatic pump, it will not be necessary to have an maintenance man at the south disposal plant. The sewerage will flow from that area through the new line to be installed to the east disposal plant, where it will be treated and processed in a sanitary manner.
