

Wounded Feb. 9 --

Rejino Awarded Purple Heart

Sp/4 Ben Rejino, Jr. received the Purple Heart on April 28 in Vietnam, he informed his parents here this month.

Rejino was wounded February 9 while on patrol in Vietnam. A member of the 1st Division, U. S. Army, he and his patrol had settled down for the night about 9 p.m. when a mine exploded nearby. He received fragment injuries to the right leg and was hospitalized about two weeks.

Rejino returned to his patrol

duty after recuperating from the injury.

He entered the Army May 3, 1966 and was sent to Vietnam October 23, 1966. Rejino expects to return home next October.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Ben C. Rejino, Sr., he was graduated from Bovina High School in 1962. He took a drafting course from Draughton's Business College in Wichita Falls and then returned to Bovina to aid his father in farming operations here.

the structures on Running Water Draw near Bovina and construct a larger structure north of Lazbuddie, or abandon the project.

Cost of the dams will be paid by the federal government.

Landowners involved in the structure north of Highway 60 indicated they didn't want the dam or the lake on their land and they weren't interested in selling their land. Therefore, it would have been necessary to condemn the land with the county paying the cost of it.

During the discussion, it was pointed out that the Trimble site was the better of the two since no condemnation was necessary.

Andy Hurst of Friona, who has served on a committee of county leaders to work with the soil conservation district and the commissioners court, co-sponsors of the project, pointed out that the committee had originally selected the Trimble (South Bovina) site, but hadn't made further recommendation since the cost of weighting the pipeline and raising the road was learned.

He pointed out the committee's recommendation had to be acted on by the court before it was valid.

County Judge Loyde A. Brewer pointed out the commissioners court "wants to know what people of the county want to do."

Leon Grissom, chairman of PCS&WCD board of supervisors, said the board wants to locate the dams where they will do the most good for the county.

Prior to presentation of the eventually-passed motion, Tom Lewellen, commissioner from Friona precinct, asked the group, "How many would be in favor of spending \$161,000 of county money to build a lake on private land?"

Details of calling the bond election are expected to be worked out in the near future.

It happened one day about noon, going toward my boat ... I stood like one thunderstruck.

That startling second when Robinson Crusoe finds a footprint in the sand on his island has left an impression on many readers. The story of the shipwrecked sailor quickly captured the public fancy when it was published in 1719.

Today it is still a best seller, reports Whitman Publishing Company of Racine, Wis., world's largest publisher of children's books.

Any youngster loves to discover the book. Every adult enjoys re-reading this favorite fiction.

"Robinson Crusoe appeals to our basic instincts," comments Whitman's editorial director H. M. Benstead, Jr., "because we all wonder how we'd survive in a wilderness, how we'd change, how resourceful we'd be, whether or not we'd be saved."

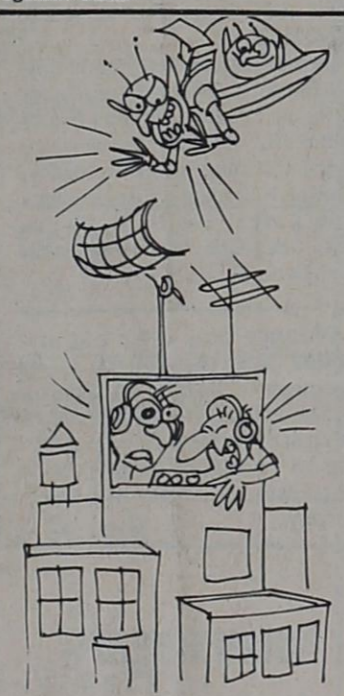
When the hero triumphs, we all do. Daniel Defoe's book was certainly an early popular cliff-hanger, long before the Saturday serial. Since then the same theme has been used in novels, movies, television series, but never has the struggle been so solitary.

The book has special value today when so many youngsters are city-bred and may know only that things are bought.

Children are amazed at how Crusoe built his house, dug his cave, fired pottery, learned to make cheese, hewed a canoe, made goat-skin clothes, pounded corn for bread—and never could make ink until a rescuer explained the art.

A book of this kind could start the family off on a number of small expeditions to learn how a human being with no recourse but his hands could survive. There could be trips to weavers to see looms in action, museum trips to study cave man and how he made weapons and bowls, an outing to a farm, a trip to a bakery, a visit to an Indian or Eskimo craft exhibit and more.

Luckily, none of us is likely to be marooned. But it's a comfort to a reader of any age to learn how humanity can endure and prevail against odds.
