MIAMI, Fla., June 7 (UP)—The U. S. Destroyer Saufley steamed toward the mainland today carrying 37 survivors of a charter plane crash who watched in horror while a fellow passenger was being eaten alive by sharks.

Nine Puerto Ricans were known to have died when the twin-engine C-46 crash-landed in the Atlantic ocean Monday night 270 miles off the Florida coast. Eighteen others were presumed dead.

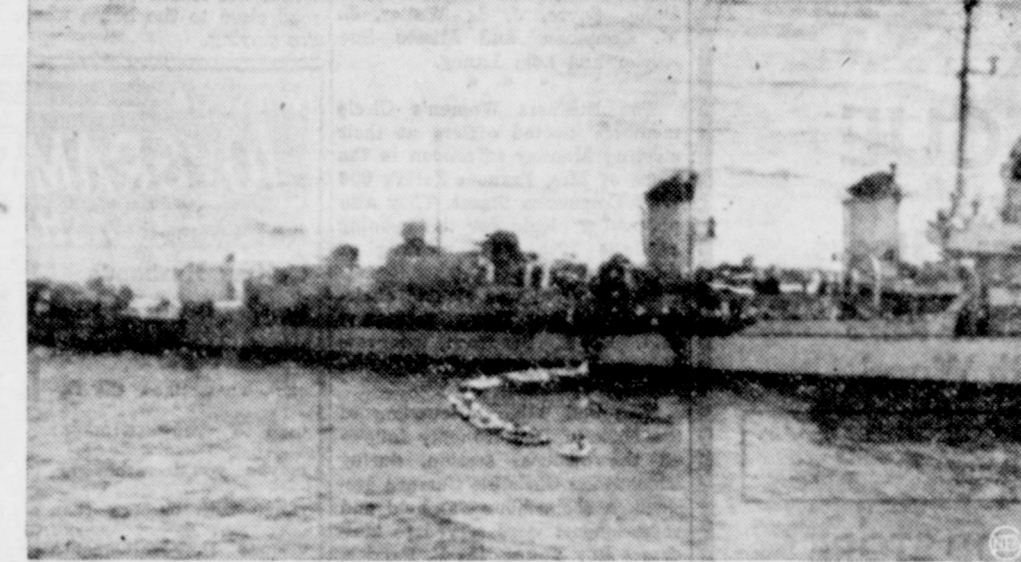

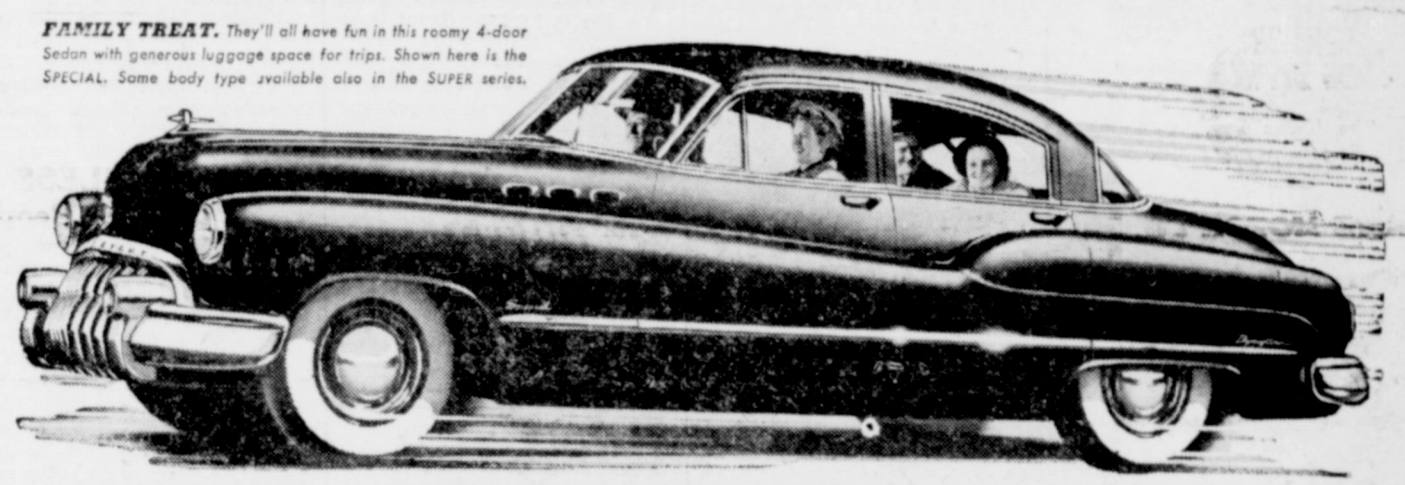

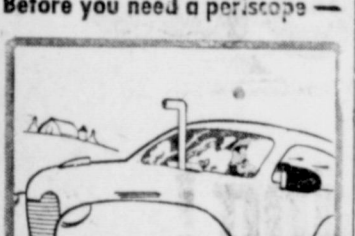
