## From The Chief's Desk

This week's topic will be on ages and not lawfully exempt or juveniles not attending school and
juveniles having beer parties. In the past few weeks, I hav noticed that an alarming number
of juveniles are not attending school and it seems that the parents don't really care if they do or not.
I would like to let the citizens of Bovina know what the Texas Education Code says about ompulsory attendance and
he penalties for violating this code.
Article
21.032 Compulsory Attendance states: "Every child in he state who is as much as seven seven years of age and has previously been enrolled in first grade, and who has not completed he academic year in which his be required to attend the public schools in the district of his residence or in some other district to which he may be transferred as provided or authorized by law a
minimum of 170 days of regular school term of the district in which the child resides or to which he has been transferred. A child enrolled in pre-kindergarten or kindergarten must attend class mininum of 85 days during erach semester for which the child is enrolled.
The penalty for violating this code comes under Article 4.25 of any parent or person standing in parental relation to a child, within he compulsory school attendance

attendance officer to warn, in writing, the parent or person standing in parental relation that attendance must be immediately required. If after this warning, the parental relation intentionally knowingly, recklessly, or with criminal negligence fails to require
the child to attend school as required by law, the parent or
person standing in parental relation commits an offense. "The attendance officer shall county complaint against him in of his resident precinct, or in the municipal court of the municipality in which he resides. An
offense under this section is punishable by a fine of not less than $\$ 5$ dollars nor more than $\$ 25$ less than $\$ 10$ nor more than $\$ 50$ not less than $\$ 25$ dollars nor more than $\$ 100$ dollars for a subsequent offense. Each day the child remains out of school after the warning has
been given or the child ordered to been given or the child ordered to
school by the juvenile court may constitute a separate offense."
Since the end of the school yea is nearing and the different partie and dances will be commencing we need to remember that making minors is a violation of the law. All parties will be checked closely and if an alcoholic beverage is being consumed by minors, then
whoever is responsible for that whoever is responsible for that
residence or party place will be charged and all in attendance will be arrested and charged with the appropriate charges. You als need to remember that if you
provided minors with alcoholic beverages, you are responsible in case of injuries to that minor after hey leave your property.
Remember it difference if makes alcoholic beverages or not, it is still a violation of the law to let minors consume an alcoholic beverage on your property. The sheriff's will be used if raids are necessary Thank you for your cooperation in these matters. These laws will be strictly enforced.
