All of All of Washington was very
interesting but the underground interesting but the underground Metro system was one of the most
amazing things we saw. We would not imagine how many truck loads of dirt must have been removed from underground just to build the
Metro. The Metro not only is in Metro. The Metro not only is in the city proper but it begins as far
out as thirty miles so that more people can utilize its services. extended farther so that more of the people in the suburbs can take the
On Sunday afternoon, we rode the Metro for the first time. Don
wanted to show us how to ride it and how to change lines when we get off so we would be at the museums and various other sights

We even saw the room where Gen. Washington died. There was gazebo built on the Potomac River
so that Washington's friends could come see them by boat instead of traveling by land if they live
across the Potomac in Maryland. On Sunday night, we went to visit my aunt. We stayed there the rest of the week and caught the
Metro to see the sights we had not Metro
seen.

On Monday, we went to the
National Air and Space Museum. We saw many of the famous early airplanes, one of The Spirit of St

It was the Arts and Industries Museum. at the World's Fair in Philadelphia in 1876, during our Centennial celebration. One of the most impressive exhibits in that building
was the pedal driven was the pedal driven table saw. The table saw has not changed much
since 1852 except now it has an electric motor.
Another enjoyable museum
was the Museum of American History. This museum contained the tent of Gen. George
Washington, the flag that was made by Betsy Ross and her helpers, the inaugural gowns worn by Jackie inaugural gowns worn by Jackie Nancy Reagan, Barbara Bush and Hillary Clinton. This museum depicted
A huge African elephant, the
world's largest stuffed specimen of
this species greeted us as we entered this species greeted us as we entered the Museum of Natural History. There were many dinosaur
skeletons, some of them were found in Utah, Oregon and Colorado. Hope Diamond is on display at this museum. The Hope Diamond is the world's largest diamond. It is a deep-blue, 40 -karat diamond surrounded

House Chambers and listen to some of the House members.
We went to the Arlingto Cemetery where 20,111 people are buried. One of the most patriotic moments I have ever experienced is
the changing of the guards at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier There were about 100 to 125 people
at the ceremony and everyone wa so quiet that you could hear the soldiers click their heels together.

On Wednesday, we went to the atop one of the loftiest spots in Washington. It was finally finished in 1990 after beginning work on it more than 100 years ago. The
building has many chapels that are used for weddings, funerals and baptisms, besides the huge sanctuary that seats at least 5000 people. This sanctuary is used for
worship each Sunday. The stained worship each Sunday. The stained
glass used in the cathedral is as glass used in the cathedral is as
magnificent as any you have seen in pictures of the ancient cathedrals in Europe.

will go. Velma and I heard a fellow minister say this past week that he had been blessed to go to Israe hree different times.
"Each time," he said, "as I stood at Jordon's Calvary, the most likely transfixed with tears streamin down my cheeks."
"What shall I do, then, with
esus who is called Christ?" Pilat asked. They all answered, 'Crucify im!'" (Matthew 27:22). How do
ou answer Pilate's question today?
"What shall I do, then, with Jesus?"
Pilate tried to be neutral. As
Roman governor of Judea, he did
not want to put to death a man he
knew to be innocent. But neither
did he want to buck the powerful
Jewish leaders who wanted Jesus
dead.
To exonerate himself of Christ's
blood, he attempted to wash his
hands of the entire affair $(\mathrm{v}$. 24).
But his cowardice before the crowd
sealed his true decision. He allowed
Jesus to die.
When it comes to Christ and his
death on the cross, there is no
middle ground. We either believe
Jesus is Savior and Lord, or, we do
not. But we cannot simply stay
neutral and pretend it does not
matter. "For the message of the
cross is foolishness to those who
are perishing, but to us who are
being saved it it the power of God."
(1 Corinthians $1: 18$.. The cross is
either ridiculous, or else it is
redemption!
I have a feeling that when I
someday stand at Jordon' Calvary,
that like our minister friend, the
tears will flow, and I know that I
will say, "My Savior and my God!"
