# Muleshoe woman dies in house fire

A 97-year-old Muleshoe woman died in an early morning house fire Wednesday at 1727 West Ave. E.

Hattie Jones, who was found in a northeast bedroom of her residence, died of smoke inhalation, based on autopsy reports, Muleshoe Fire

Marshall Jimmy Mills said.

Jones' niece Dorothy Matthiesen was also in the home at the time of the fire. She escaped without injury.

Both women were apparently asleep when the fire broke out, officials said.

According to reports, the Muleshoe Volunteer Fire De-

partment responded to a call at 5:10 a.m. at the residence on Wednesday. When they arrived, one bedroom was engulfed with fire, Muleshoe Fire Chief Donald Harrison said. He said it appears the fire started in an unoccupied room on the northwest bedroom.

Mills said that an exact cause

of the fire was not determined, but it has been ruled an accident.

Mills said that the house probably sustained at least \$15,000 in damage. Approximately 18 firemen helped fight the fire with five units on the scene.

Jones was reportedly dead

by the time firefighters were able to enter the residence. The

home was not equipped with a smoke detector.

Jones had lived in Muleshoe since 1980, moving here from Clovis, N.M.

## MHS assistant principal to undergo open-heart surgery

David Jenkins, the assistant principal at Muleshoe High School, is expected to undergo open-heart bypass surgery in a couple of weeks after suffering a massive heart attack on Thanksgiving Day.

Jenkins was discharged

from High Plains Hospital in Amarillo on Wednesday, according to a hospital spokesperson, and is recovering at a facility near the hospital, where he can continue to be monitored.

Jenkins was visiting rela-

tives in Clayton when the attack occurred. He was airlifted to High Plains. Doctors are currently waiting for Jenkins to gain strength before performing the procedure.

Bill Moore, Muleshoe Schools Superintendent said

that he spoke with Jenkins a few days ago and is awaiting surgery.

"He just needs to rest and take it easy so he can have surgery," Moore said. "Once he gets that done, they say he will be as good as new. So we

are all keeping our fingers crossed."

Jenkins assumed the position of assistant principal at MHS this fall. He is the former principal of Portales High School in Portales, N.M.

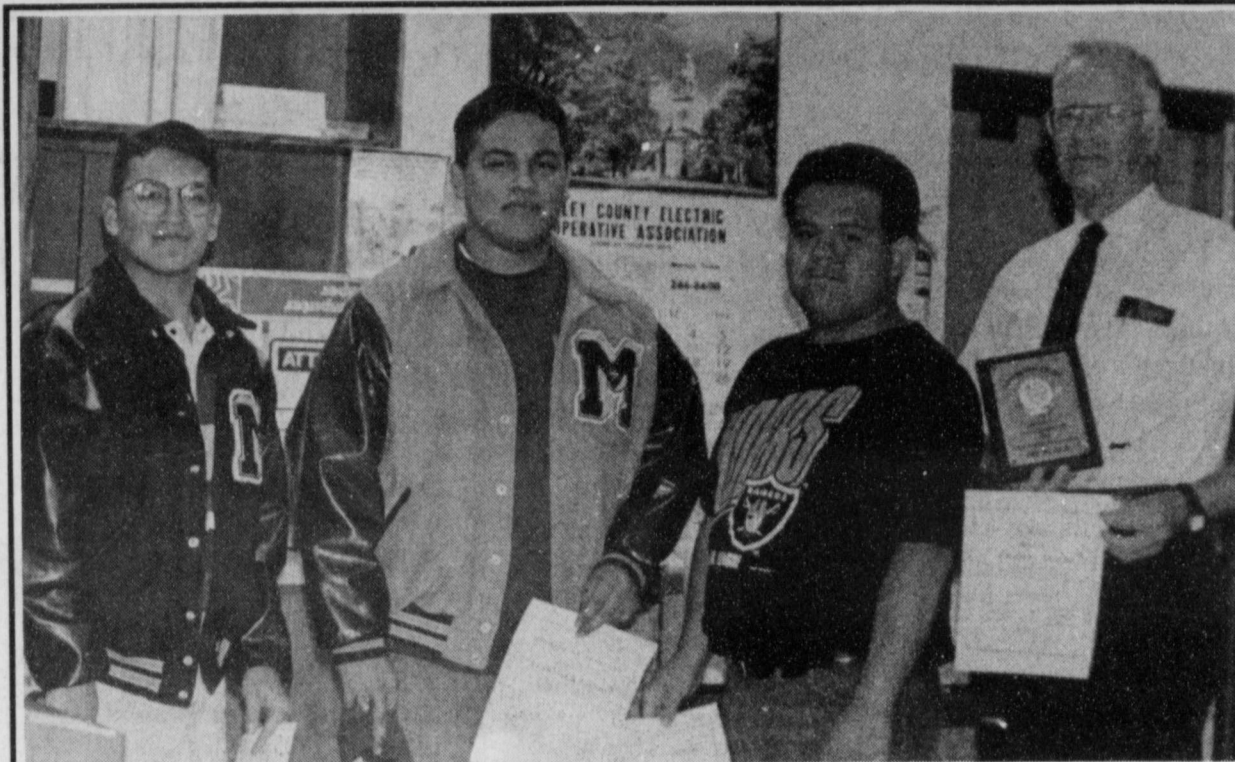
# SCAC helps spread holiday cheer

Thanksgiving evening The Dawg and I went out the door together. His job was to try


