

A person who does not levelop a well-rounded personality as a child, then, would perhaps modify his relations with his fellowman and his attitude towards the demands of life to try to fit them into the shape of his own "wheel", misinformed in childhood. If the tree pases of life could still work together you would perhaps call that person neurotic", a person who seems o function a bit lop-sidedly but till within the realms of normal. Such a person would not have good mental health, but neither Mental iilness would more accurately be represented by breakdown of one of those wheels.


his week the United States will focus its attention on the oil industry's contributions to the high American standard of living, to the nation's industrial progress, and to the national defense. This is Oil Progress Week.
