County Judge Porter Roberts explained that the county had been allowing for inflation in recent years by using from the county's surplu
funds in recent years. Now, funds have been depleted, and in addition, the county has lost an annual payment from the lateral road program, and may not rec

Despite, the raise in the tax ratio (from 15 per cent of fair market value to 25 per cent), the county will still have to transfer some $\$ 180,000$ out of a balanced budget.
The 1981 budget provides for very few capital improvements, but does provide for salary raises of approximately 15 per cent for county
employees, whose salaries have been sadly lagging behind comparable counties.
